
# 1 SAMUEL 20 vs 25



In the 350 years of the judges before this book; years characterize by the phrase: and the children of Israel did evil in the sight of the Lord. Obviously, the Lord said enough and sent Samuel, who was the last judge; a good judge, who moved in the power of the Spirit.

This first book of Samuel, focuses on 3 principle people: Samuel, from his birth to his death, Saul, the first king – the people's choice, and David, the blessed king, the Lord's choice.

Saul vents his anger at the absence of David,



- $^{25}$  And the king sat on his seat, as at other times, even on a seat by the wall: and Jonathan arose, and Abner sat by Saul's side, and David's place was empty.
- <sup>26</sup> Nevertheless Saul said nothing that day: for he thought, Something has happened to him, he is not clean; surely he is not clean.
- <sup>27</sup> And it happened the next day, which was the second day of the new moon, that David's place was empty: so Saul said to Jonathan his son, Why has the son of Jesse not come to meal, yesterday, or today?
- <sup>28</sup> Jonathan then answered Saul, David earnestly asked leave of me to go to Bethlehem:
- <sup>29</sup> And he said, Please let me go, for our family has a sacrifice in the city; and my brother has commanded me to attend. And now, if I have found favor in your eyes, let me get away, please, and see my brothers. For this reason he has not come to the king's table.
- <sup>30</sup> Then Saul's anger burned against Jonathan, and he said to him, You son of the perverse rebellious woman, do I not know you have chosen the son of Jesse to your own shame, and to the shame of you mother's nakedness?
- <sup>31</sup> For as long as the son of Jesse lives on earth, neither you nor your kingdom will be established. Therefore now send and get him for me, for he must surely die.
- $^{32}$  And Jonathan answered Saul his father, and said to him, Why should he be killed? what has he done?
- <sup>33</sup> Then Saul hurled a javelin at him to strike him: so Jonathan knew that his father decided to kill David.
- <sup>34</sup> Then Jonathan arose from the table in fierce anger, and did no eat food the second day of the new moon: for he was grieved over David, because his father dishonored him.

<sup>35</sup> Now it happened in the morning, that Jonathan went out to the field at the appointed time with David, and a little lad with him.

 $^{36}$  And he said to his lad, Run, now find the arrows which I shoot. And as the lad ran, he shot an arrow beyond him.

<sup>37</sup> When the lad reached the place of the arrow which Jonathan had shot, Jonathan cried out to the lad, and said, Is not the arrow beyond you?

 $^{38}$  And Jonathan cried out after the lad, Hurry, be quick, do not stay. And Jonathan's lad gathered the arrows, and came to his master.

<sup>39</sup> But the lad was not aware of anything: only Jonathan and David knew about the matter.

<sup>40</sup> Then Jonathan gave his weapons to his lad, and said to him, Go, bring them to the city.

<sup>41</sup> And as soon as the lad was gone, David arose from the south side, and fell on his face to the ground, and bowed three times: and they kissed each other, and wept together, but David grieved greatly.

<sup>42</sup> And Jonathan said to David, Go in peace, for we have sworn both of us in the name of the LORD, saying, The LORD is with me and you, and with my seed and your seed forever. And he arose and departed: and Jonathan went into the city.
