
1 TIMOTHY 5 vs 1



Paul wrote 3 pastoral letters addressing the care of the assemblies and requirements for its leaders; 2 letters to Timothy who was the son of a Greek father and devout Jewish mother; and 1 letter to Titus. Timothy oversaw the work in Ephesus and Asia Minor.

- ¹ Do not scold an older man, but urge him like a father; and the younger men as brothers;
- ² older women as mothers; younger women as sisters, with all cleanliness.
- ³ Honor widows who are truly widows / those who have lost the love of their life; treat them kindly.



- ⁴ If any widow has children or grandchildren, let them learn first to show good-sense at home, and repay their parents: for this is good and agreeable before God.
- ⁵ The widow who truly in need, and left alone, who has her hope in God, and continues night and day in petitions and prayers;
- ⁶ yet, if she who indulges in a lavish life, is dead while she lives.
- 7 In these things instruct, that they should be blameless.
- ⁸ But if anyone does not provide for his own family, especially for his own household, he has denied the faith, and is worse than an unbeliever.
- ⁹ No widow is to be enrolled on the support list: unless she is at least sixty years old, being the wife of one husband;
- ¹⁰ and is well known for good works like: if she raised children, was hospitable to foreigners, washed the saints feet, helped the distressed, and devoted herself to every good work / always giving her best effort to help.
- 11 But refuse to enroll younger widows: for when their desires draw them away from Christ, they will marry;
- 12 and they will receive their sentence, because they set aside their original faith.
- ¹³ At the same time they also learn to be idle, strolling from house to house; and not only idle, but also gossips and busybodies, saying things they should not say.

¹⁴So, I want the younger women to marry, have children, manage their house, and give no space for the adversary to accuse.

- 16 If any believing woman has widows in their family, let her help them, and not burden the church; so it help those who are indeed widows.
- ¹⁷ The elders who are good leaders, are worthy of double honor, especially those who labor in the preaching and teaching.
- ¹⁸ For the scripture says, Do not muzzle the ox that treads out the corn. The worker is worthy of his wage.
- ¹⁹ Do not accept an accusation against an elder, unless it is supported by ² or ³ witnesses.
- ²⁰ Publicly reprimand those who continue in sin, so that the rest might fear.
- ²¹I charge you before God, and the Lord Jesus Christ, and the elect angels, that you observe these things without prejudice, doing nothing out of favoritism.
- ²² Do not be quick to appoint an elder, and share in the sins of another: keep yourself clean.
- ²³No longer drink only water, but use a little wine for your stomach and frequent illnesses.
- ²⁴ The sins of some people are obvious, preceding them to judgment; but for others surface later.
- ²⁵ Likewise, good works are obvious; and those that are not obvious cannot stay hid.
