
1 TIMOTHY 6 vs 1



Paul wrote 3 pastoral letters addressing the care of the assemblies and requirements for its leaders; 2 letters to Timothy who was the son of a Greek father and devout Jewish mother; and 1 letter to Titus. Timothy oversaw the work in Ephesus and Asia Minor.

- ¹ All who are under the yoke as slaves should regard their own masters worthy of all respect, that the name of God and His teaching will not be blasphemed.
- ² Those who have believing masters, must not disrespect them, because they are brothers; but rather serve them all the more, because those who partake of the benefit are faithful and beloved. Teach and urge these things.



- ³ If anyone teaches false doctrine, and does not agree with sound teaching of our Lord Jesus Christ, and teaching that promotes good-sense;
- ⁴ he is conceited, and understands nothing, but has an unhealthy interest in disputes and arguments over words. From this comes envy, discord, slander, evil suspicions,
- ⁵ and constant debates among those of corrupt minds, deprived of the truth, who imagine that good-sense is a way to material gain: depart from such.
- ⁶ But good-sense with contentment is great gain.
- ⁷For we brought nothing into this world, and we can take nothing out.
- ⁸ If we have food and clothing, with these, be content.
- ⁹ But those who want to be rich fall into temptation, -- a snare, and many foolish and harmful desires plunge people into destruction and ruin.
- ¹⁰ For the love of money is the root of all evil: and some while stretching after it, they have stumbled from the faith, and pierced themselves with many regrets.
- ¹¹But you, man of God, flee these things; and pursue rightness, good-sense, faith, love, endurance, gentleness.
- ¹² Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold of eternal life, to which you were also called, and confessed a good confession before many witnesses.
- ¹³ In the presence of God, who gives life to all, and of Christ Jesus, who gave a good confession testified before Pontius Pilate;

¹⁴I charge you, keep this instruction without fault or failure, until the appearing of our Lord Jesus Christ:

¹⁵ He will bring this about in His own time –

He is the blessed and only Sovereign,

the King of kings, and Lord of lords;

¹⁶ who alone is immortal, who lives in unapproachable light; whom no one has seen, or can see: to whom be honor and power everlasting. Amen.

¹⁷ Instruct those who are rich in the present age to not be arrogant, or set their hope on uncertain riches, but on God, the One who gives us richly all things to enjoy;

¹⁸ That they do good, that they be rich in good works, generous to distribute, ready to share;

¹⁹ Treasuring up for themselves a good foundation against the time to come, that they may take hold of what is truly life.

²⁰ Timothy, guard what is entrusted to you, avoid profane, empty babblings, and opposing arguments of science falsely so called:

²¹ which some professing from the faith have deviated. Grace be with you. Amen.
