ACTS 16 vs 1



The previous chapter ended saying: And there arose a sharp disagreement between them, that they separated from one another: and so Barnabas took Mark, and sailed to Cyprus; But Paul chose Silas, and departed, being committed by the brothers to the grace of God. And he went through Syria and Cilicia, reinforcing the churches. Remember Luke is writing this.

The Assemblies revisited.

- ¹ Then he came to Derbe and Lystra: and behold, a disciple there, named Timothy, the son of a Jewish woman, who believed; but his father was a Greek:
- ² and he as well spoken of by the brothers who were at Lystra and Iconium.



- ³ And Paul wanted this one to go with him; and he took him and circumcised him because of the Jews who were in those parts: for they all knew that his father was a Greek.
- ⁴ Now as they passed through the cities, they delivered the decrees for them to keep, by the apostles and elders who were in Jerusalem.
- ⁵ And so the assemblies were established in the faith, and increased in number daily.
- ⁶ Now when they had gone through Phrygia and the region of Galatia, they were forbidden by the Holy Spirit to preach the word in Asia,
- ⁷ and after came to Mysia, they tried to go to Bithynia: but the Spirit did not permit them.
- ⁸ And they passing by Mysia came down to Troas.
- ⁹ And a vision appeared to Paul in the night; a man of Macedonia stood appealing him, saving, Come over to Macedonia, and help us.
- 10 And when he had seen the vision, immediately we / including Luke endeavored to go to Macedonia, concluding that the Lord had called us to preach the gospel to them.
- 11 So putting out to sea from Troas, we went straight to Samothrace, and the next day to Neapolis;
- 12 and from there to Philippi, which is a chief city in that part of Macedonia, a roman colony: and we stayed in that city for some days.
- ¹³ And on the sabbath we went outside the city to a riverside, where prayers were made; and we sat down, and spoke to the women who assembled there.

- ¹⁴ And a woman named Lydia, a seller of purple fabric, from the city of Thyatira, a worshiper of God, heard us: and the Lord opened her heart, responding to the things Paul spoke.
- ¹⁵ When she and her household were baptized, she urged us / including Luke, saying, If you have judged me as faithful to the Lord, come to my house, and stay there. And she prevailed.
- ¹⁶ And it happened, as we went to the place of prayer, a girl having a spirit of divination met us, who brought her masters much profit by fortunetelling:
- ¹⁷ And following Paul and us, she continued crying out, saying, These men are the servants of the Most High God, who proclaim to us the way of salvation.
- 18 And she did this for many days. But Paul, being annoyed, turned and said to the spirit, I command you in the name of Jesus Christ, come out of her. And it came out the same hour.
- 19 And when her masters saw that the hope of their gains was gone, they grabbed Paul and Silas, and dragged them to the marketplace before the authorities,
- 20 And when they brought them to the magistrates, they said, These men, being Jews, are greatly troubling our city,
- ²¹ and teach customs, that are not lawful for us to accept, nor to observe, being Romans.
- 22 And the crowd arose against them: and the magistrates tore off their robes, and ordered to beat them.
- 23 And when they inflicted them with many stripes, they threw them to prison, ordering the jailor to guard them securely:
- ²⁴ and he, having received such a charge, threw them into prison, and fastened their feet in the stocks.
- 25 And at midnight Paul and Silas prayed, and sang praises to God: and the prisoners heard them.
- ²⁶ And suddenly there was an earthquake, so great that the foundations of the prison were shaken: and immediately the doors were opened, and every one's chains were undone.
- 27 And the jailer of the prison aroused from sleep, and seeing the prison doors open, he drew his sword, and would have killed himself, supposing that the prisoners had escaped.
- $^{28}\,\mathrm{But}$ Paul cried with a loud voice, saying, Do Yourself no harm: for we are all here.

- ²⁹ Then he called for a light, and rushed in, trembling with fear, and he fell down before Paul and Silas,
- ³⁰ And brought them out, and said, Sirs, what must I do to be saved?
- ³¹ And they said, Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and you and your house will be saved.
- ³² And they spoke the word of the Lord to him, and to all who were in his house.
- ³³ And he took them the same hour of the night, and washed their stripes; and immediately was baptized, he and all his house.
- ³⁴ And when he brought them to his house, he set food before them, and rejoiced, believing in God with all his house.
- ³⁵ And when it was day, the magistrates sent the police, saying, Let those men go.
- ³⁶ And the jailer of the prison reported this saying to Paul, The chief magistrates have sent to release you: so now leave, and go in peace.
- ³⁷ But Paul said to them, They have beaten us publicly without trial, and threw us to prison being Romans; and now are they throwing us out in secret? Truly no; but let them come themselves and bring us out.
- ³⁸ And the police reported these words to the chief magistrates: and they feared, when they heard that they were Romans.
- ³⁹ And they came and appealed to them, and brought them out, and begged them to leave the city.
- ⁴⁰ And they went out of the prison, and entered to the house of Lydia: and when they saw the brothers, they encouraged them, and departed.
