
AMOS 4 vs 1



¹ Hear this word, you cows of Bashan that are on the mountain of Samaria / you sluggish and overfed; some scholars suggest Amos is addressing the wealthy women; definitely he is addressing the sluggish, overfed...

who oppress the poor, who crush the needy, who say to their husband,



² The Lord GOD has sworn by His holiness,

Behold, the days are coming, that they will take you away with hooks, and the last of you with fishhooks.

³ You will go out through the breaches / led like cattle, one after another; and you will be driven along to Harmon, declares the LORD.

Next, Amos gives a sarcastic call to worship:

⁴ Come to Bethel and rebel;

at Gilgal multiply your rebellion / in these historical towns of great promise to the people of God: Bethel where Abraham gave offering to God, where Jacob rested and a stairway to heaven appeared; Gilgal, where they entered the land promised to their fathers under the leadership of Joshua; sin like crazy;

and bring your sacrifices every morning, and your tithes every three years:

⁵ Offer a sacrifice of thanksgiving with leaven / strictly forbidden in the Mosaic law -- Lev. 6,

and proclaim freewill offerings: for this you like to do, you children *supposedly* ruled by God, said the Lord GoD.

⁶ I gave you cleanness of teeth / absolutely nothing to eat... in all your cities; and lack of food in all your places:

1 yet you did not return to Me, declares the LORD / Moses warned this people; in this chapter, 5 times the Lord kindly warns His people of their careless rebellion... attempting to get their attention.

⁷ I also withheld the rain from you, with three months before the harvest. Then I sent rain on one town, and no rain on another:

one field was rained on, while a field where it did not rain withered.

- ⁸ So two or three towns staggered to another, to drink water, but were not satisfied:
- 2 yet you did not return to Me, declares the LORD.
- ⁹ I smote your gardens and your vineyards with a scorching wind and mildew: when your fig trees and your olive trees increased, the palmerworm devoured them / read about it in Joel:
- 3 yet you did not return to Me, declares the LORD.
- ¹⁰ I sent plagues among you, after the manner of Egypt: I killed your young men by the sword, and took away your horses; I made the stink of your camps to come up to your nostrils / the smell of battle and death:
- 4 yet you did not return to Me, declares the LORD.
- ¹¹I overthrew some of you, as God overthrew Sodom and Gomorrah, and you were like a firebrand snatched from the fire:
- 5 yet you did not return to Me, declares the LORD.
- ¹² So, I will do this to you, O Israel:

and because I do this to you, prepare to meet your God, O Israel.

/ unwilling to respond to the soft touch and discipline of a loving Father; next the LORD God turns up the heat. After all, no earthly trailer trash will populate His eternity. C.S. Lewis wisely pointed out, our little errors... in a million years, might not look so little. We don't miss eternity with an "oops" or a "sorry"
