

Introduction

- ¹ These are the words which Moses spoke to all Israel across the Jordan in the wilderness, in the Arabah opposite the Red Sea, between Paran and Tophel, and Laban and Hazeroth, and Dizahab.
- ²(It is eleven days' journey from Horeb by way of Mount Seir to Kadesh-barnea.)
- ³ And it happened in the fortieth year, on the first day of the eleventh month, that Moses spoke to the children of Israel, according to all the LORD had commanded him for them;
- ⁴after he defeated Sihon the king of the Amorites, who lived in Heshbon, and Og the king of Bashan, who lived at Astaroth in Edrei:
- ⁵ across the Jordan, in the land of Moab, Moses began to declare this law, saying,
- ⁶The LORD our God spoke to us in Horeb, saying, You have stayed long enough at this mountain:
- ⁷Turn, and set your journey, and go to the hill country of the Amorites, and to all the neighbors in the Arabah, in the hill country, and in the lowlands, and in the south, and by the seashore, the land of the Canaanites and Lebanon, as far as the great river, the river Euphrates.
- 8 Behold, I have set the land before you:

enter and possess the land which the LORD pledged to your fathers, Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, to give to them and to their descendants after them.



- ⁹And I spoke to you at that time, saying, I am not able to bear the burden of you alone.
- ¹⁰ The LORD your God has multiplied you, and behold, you are this day as the stars of heaven for a multitude.
- ¹¹May the LORD God of your fathers increase you a thousand-fold more than you are, and bless you, just as He promised you!
- ¹² How can I alone bear the load and your burden, and your strife?
- ¹³Choose wise and discerning men, from among your tribes, and I will appoint them as your heads.
- ¹⁴And you answered me, and said, The thing which you said to do is good.
- ¹⁵So I took the heads of your tribes, wise and experienced men, and appointed them heads over you, leaders over thousands, and of hundreds, and of fifties, and of tens, and officers of your tribes.
- ¹⁶And I charged your judges at that time, saying, Hear the cases between your brethren, and judge rightly between a man and his brother, and the outsider who is with him.
- ¹⁷You will not show partiality in judgment; you will hear the small and the great alike; You will not fear man; for the judgment is God's: and the case that is too hard for you, you will bring to me, and I will hear it.
- ¹⁸ And I commanded you at that time all that you should do.

Israel at Kadesh-barnea

- ¹⁹When we departed from Horeb, we went through all that great and terrible wilderness, that you saw on the way to the hill country of the Amorites, just as the LORD our God commanded us; and we came to Kadesh-barnea.
- 20 And I said to you, You have come to the mountain of the Amorites, which the LORD our God will give to us.
- ²¹Behold, the LORD your God has placed the land before you: go up and possess it, as the LORD God of your fathers has said to you; do not fear, nor be discouraged.
- ²²Then all of you approached me, and said, Let us send men before us, that they search out the land for us, and bring us word of the way we should go up, and the cities we will enter.
- ²³ And the thing pleased me well: and I took twelve of your men, one from each tribe:



- ²⁴ and they turned and went up to the hill country, and came to the valley of Eshcol, and spied it out.
- ²⁵And they took of the fruit of the land in their hands, and brought it down to us, and brought us word, and said, It is a good land which the LORD our God will give us.
- ²⁶ Yet who would not go up, but rebelled against the command of the LORD your God:
- ²⁷ and you grumbled in your tents, and said, Because the LORD hates us, He brought us from the land of Egypt, to deliver us to the hand of the Amorites, to destroy us.
- ²⁸ Where can we go up? our brethren have discouraged our heart, saying, The people are bigger and taller than us; the cities are large and fortified to heaven; and besides we have seen the sons of the Anakim there / so they started talking like 3rd graders, forgetting all that the Lord had already done, destroying the 200,000 Egyptian soldiers in minutes, leaving the country virtually powerless for the next 3000 years. Who cares that there were giants in the land; God is a little bigger.
- ²⁹ Then I said to you, Do not dread, nor fear them.
- ³⁰ The LORD your God who goes before you, He Himself will fight for you, according to all that He did for you in Egypt before your eyes;
- ³¹ and in the wilderness, where you have seen how the LORD your God carried you, as a man carries his son, in all the way that you walked, until you came to this place.
- 32 But for all this, you did not believe the LORD your God,
- ³³ who goes before you on your way, to search out for you a place to encamp, in fire by night, and cloud by day, to show you what way you should go.
- 34 Then the LORD heard the sound of your words, and was angry, and pledged, saying,
- ³⁵ Surely not one of these men, of this evil generation, will see that good land, which I pledged to give to your fathers,
- ³⁶ except Caleb the son of Jephunneh; he will see it, and to him and his children I will give the land that he walked on, because he followed the LORD fully.
- ³⁷ The LORD was also angry with me on account of you, saying, You also will not enter there.
- ³⁸ Joshua the son of Nun, who stands before you, he will enter there: encourage him: for he will cause Israel to inherit it.



- ³⁹Moreover your little ones, who you said would become a prey, and your children, who this day have no knowledge of good and evil, they will enter there, and I will give it to them, and they will possess it.
- ⁴⁰But as for you, turn around, and take your journey to the wilderness by the way of the Red Sea.
- ⁴¹Then you answered and said to me, We have sinned against the LORD, we will indeed go up and fight, just as the LORD our God commanded us. And every man of you put on his weapons of war, and were suddenly ready to go up into the hill country.
- ⁴²And the LORD said to me, Say to them. Do not go up, or fight; for I am not among you; lest you be defeated before your enemies.
- ⁴³So I spoke to you; but you would not listen. Instead you rebelled against the command of the LORD, and went presumptuously up into the hill country.
- ⁴⁴And the Amorites, who lived in that hill country, came out against you, and chased you, as bees do, and crushed you from Seir to Hormah.
- ⁴⁵ Then you returned and wept before the LORD; but the LORD would not listen to your voice, nor give ear to you.
- ⁴⁶So you remained at Kadesh many days, the days remained there.
