
DEUTERONOMY 21 vs 1



Notice: these several chapters 1 - 11 speak about the Covenant God has with His people. There are NO bloody sacrificial or ceremonial laws involved with this Covenant. Faithful men and women in all ages carefully **keep** and **do** these 10 commands... which express the Covenant of God with His people.

The Lord was not lawless. He said, do not think I came to destroy the law or the prophets; whoever relaxes one of the least of the commands and teaches others to do so, will be called least in the kingdom of heaven. And on the first day of the Resurrection, the good news of Messiah did not change: beginning with Moses and the prophets He explained to them things concerning Himself. According to Jesus... loving our Father in heaven with all our heart, soul, mind and strength... is not a bad thing to do; rather, it's a perfect, good thing to do.



Manslaughter,

- ¹ If a slain person is found on the land which the LORD your God gives you to possess, lying in the open field, and it is not known who killed him:
- ² then your elders and your judges will go out, and they will measure the distance to the cities which are around the one who is slain:
- ³ and it will be, that the city, which is nearest the slain man, that is the elders of that city will take a heifer, which has not been worked, and which has not pulled a yoke;
- ⁴ and the elders of that city will bring down the heifer into a valley with running water, which has not been plowed or sown, and will break the heifer's neck there in the valley:
- ⁵ and the priests the sons of Levi will come near; for the LORD your God has chosen them to minister to Him, and to bless in the name of the LORD;

and every dispute and every assault will be settled by them:

- ⁶ And all the elders of that city, which is nearest the slain man, will wash their hands over the heifer whose neck was broken in the valley:
- ⁷ And they will answer and say, Our hands have not shed this blood, nor did our eyes see it.
- ⁸ Be merciful, O LORD, to your people Israel, whom You have redeemed,

and do not place the guilt of innocent blood in the midst of your people Israel.

And the blood guiltiness will be forgiven them.

 9 So you will remove the guilt of innocent blood from among you, when you do what is right in the sight of the LORD.

Marriage and family life

- 10 When you go forth to war against your enemies, and the LORD your God has delivered them to your hands, and you have taken them captive,
- 11 and you see among the captives a beautiful woman, and have a desire for her, and would take her as your wife;
- ¹² then you will bring her home to your house, and she will shave her head, and trim her nails;
- ¹³ and she will remove the clothes of her captivity from her, and will remain in your house, and mourn her father and her mother a full month: and after that you may go in to her, and be her husband, and she will be your wife.
- ¹⁴ And it will be, if you are not pleased with her, then you will let her go wherever she wishes; but you will certainly not sell her for money, nor will you mistreat her, because you have humbled her.
- ¹⁵ If a man has two wives, one loved, and the other unloved, and both the loved and unloved have born him children, and if the firstborn son be hers who was unloved:
- 16 then it will be, when he wills his sons to inherit that which he has, he cannot make the son of the one loved firstborn before the son of the unloved, who is indeed the firstborn:
- ¹⁷ but he will acknowledge the son of the unloved as the firstborn, giving him a double portion of all he has: for he is the beginning of his strength; the right of the firstborn is his.
- ¹⁸ If a man has a stubborn and rebellious son, who will not obey the voice of his father, or his mother, and when they chastened him, will not even listen to them:
- 19 then his father and mother will seize him, and bring him out to the elders of his city, at the gateway of his home town;
- ²⁰ and they will say to the elders of his city, This son of ours is stubborn and rebellious, he will not obey us; he is a glutton, and a drunkard.
- ²¹ Then all the men of his city will stone him to death: so you will remove the evil from among you; and all Israel will hear of it, and fear.

²² And if a man has committed a sin worthy of death, and he is put to death, and you hang him on a tree:

²³ his body will not remain all night on the tree, but you will surely bury him on the same day; (for he who is hanged is cursed of God;) so that your land be not defiled, which the LORD your God gives you for an inheritance.
