

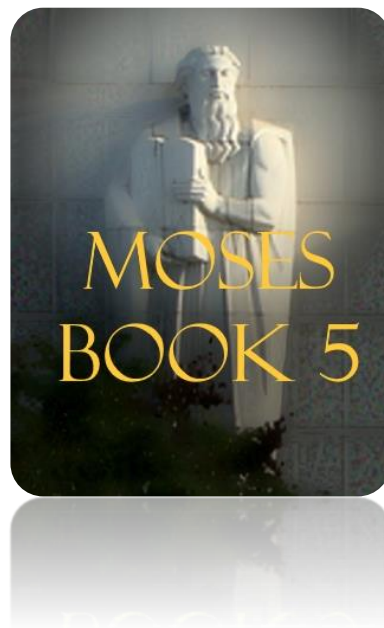
# DEUTERONOMY 2 vs 1

Notice: these several chapters 1 - 11 speak about the Covenant God has with His people. There are NO bloody sacrificial or ceremonial laws involved with this Covenant. Faithful men and women in all ages carefully **keep** and **do** these 10 commands... which express the Covenant of God with His people. **God saved His people from Egypt.**

The Lord was not lawless. He said, do not think I came to destroy the law or the prophets; whoever relaxes one of the least of the commands and teaches others to do so, will be called least in the kingdom of heaven. **<sup>1</sup> Then we turned, and went to the wilderness by the way of the Red Sea, as the LORD spoke to me: and we circled Mount Seir for many days / was He testing them to see if any complained? So was it called the Red Sea because it was the sea closest to where Esau lived; remember Esau = Red.**

**<sup>2</sup> And the LORD spoke to me, saying,**

**<sup>3</sup> you have circled this mountain long enough: now turn northward,**

**<sup>4</sup> and command the people, saying, You will pass through the territory of your brethren the children of Esau, who live in Seir; and they will fear you: so be careful:**

**<sup>5</sup> Do not meddle with them; for I will not give you any of their land, not even a footstep; because I have given Mount Seir to Esau for a possession / for this reason we say We are grateful to God that the Saudi govt has preserved the Mountain of Moses in Arabia.**

**<sup>6</sup> You will buy food from them for money, that you may eat; and you will also purchase water from them for money, that you may drink.**

**<sup>7</sup> For the LORD your God has blessed you in all you have done: He knows your wandering through this great wilderness. These forty years the LORD your God has been with you; and you have lacked nothing.**

**<sup>8</sup> So we passed beyond our brethren the children of Esau, who live in Seir, away from the Arabah road from Elath, and from Ezion-geber. And we turned and passed through the way of the wilderness of Moab.**

<sup>9</sup> And the LORD said to me, Do not harass the Moab, nor provoke them to battle: **for I will not give you any of their land for a possession**; because I have given Ar to the children of Lot as a possession.

<sup>10</sup> (The Emim lived there in the past, a people as great, numerous, and tall, as the Anakim;

<sup>11</sup> who also were considered giants, like the Anakim; but the Moabites called them Emim.

<sup>12</sup> The Horites also lived in Seir previously; but the children of **Esau** dispossessed them and destroyed them from before them, and settled in their place; just as Israel did to the land of their possession, which the LORD gave them).

<sup>13</sup> So I said, Now arise, and crossover the brook Zered. So we crossed over the brook Zered.

<sup>14</sup> And the time it took us to come from Kadesh-barnea, until we crossed over the brook Zered, was 38 years; until the whole generation of the men of war perished from among the camp, as the LORD pledged to them.

<sup>15</sup> For the hand of the LORD was against them, to destroy them from among the camp, until they perished.

<sup>16</sup> So it happened, when all the men of war finally perished from among the people,

<sup>17</sup> That the LORD spoke to me, saying,

<sup>18</sup> You will cross over Ar, at the border of Moab, today:

<sup>19</sup> And when you come near opposite the children of Ammon, do not harass them, nor meddle with them: **for I will not give you any of the land of the children of Ammon** as a possession; because I have given it to the children of Lot as a possession.

<sup>20</sup> (It is also regarded as a land of giants: for giants lived there previously; and the Ammonites call them Zamzummim;

<sup>21</sup> a people as great, and numerous, and tall, as the Anakim; but the LORD destroyed them before them; and they dispossessed them, and settled in their place:

<sup>22</sup> just as He did to the children of **Esau**, who lived in Seir, when He destroyed the Horites from before them; and they dispossessed them, and settled in their place even to this day:

<sup>23</sup> and the Avvim who lived in villages as far as Gaza, the Caphtorim, who came from Caphtor, destroyed them, and settled in their place.)

<sup>24</sup> Arise, take your journey, and pass through the valley of Arnon: behold, I have given Sihon the Amorite, king of Heshbon, and his land into your hand: begin to possess it, and contend with him in battle.

<sup>25</sup> This day I will begin to put the dread and fear of you, on all the nations under the heavens, who when they hear report of you, will tremble and grieve because of you.

<sup>26</sup> So I sent messengers from the wilderness of Kedemoth to Sihon king of Heshbon with words of peace, saying,

<sup>27</sup> Let me pass through your land: I will travel only on the highway; I will not turn aside to the right or the left.

<sup>28</sup> Sell me food for money, that I may eat; and give me water for money, that I may drink: only let me pass through on foot;

<sup>29</sup> just as the children of **Esau** who live in Seir, and the Moabites who live in Ar, did for me;) until I cross over Jordan into the land which the LORD our God is giving us.

<sup>30</sup> But Sihon king of Heshbon would not let us pass through his land: for the LORD your God hardened his spirit, and made his heart obstinate, in order to deliver him to your hand, as it appears this day.

<sup>31</sup> And the LORD said to me, Behold, I have begun to deliver Sihon and his land to you: begin to occupy it, that you may possess his land.

<sup>32</sup> Then Sihon with all his people came out against us, to fight at Jahaz.

<sup>33</sup> And the LORD our God delivered him to us; and we defeated him, and his sons, and all his people.

<sup>34</sup> So we captured all his cities at that time, and utterly destroyed the men, women and children, of every city, we left no survivors:

<sup>35</sup> we took only the cattle for our booty, and the spoil of the cities which we captured.

<sup>36</sup> From Aroer, which is on the edge of the valley of Arnon, even to Gilead, there was not one city too strong for us: the LORD our God delivered all to us:

<sup>37</sup> Only you did not go near the land of the children of Ammon, all along the river Jabbok, nor the cities in the hill country, nor wherever the LORD our God commanded us.
