EXODUS 10 vs 1





10 Plagues are recorded before Pharaoh finally lets the people of the Lord go. In this chapter 2 more plagues are added to the list; a list that parallels the papyrus lpuwer. And if you really think this chapter is too fantastic to believe, well then check out the natural catastrophe at Lake NYOS in Cameroon, 1986. That sequence of plagues similarly effected those living around Lake NYOS.

- 1. The Rivers turn to blood.
- 2. Frogs come next, frogs know how to hop out of the deadly water, but they don't do well on dry land
- 3. Lice or gnats follow the frogs; frogs that hopped too far, died on the dry land; and the insects had a feast
- 4. Flies follow the lice and gnats, shortly after to also munch on all the millions of dead carcasses.
- 5. Pestilence on their cattle.
- 6. Boils, again check out the catastrophe at Lake NYOS Cameroon
- 7. Hail and fire.
- 8. Locusts.
- 9. Darkness.

Plague of locusts

¹ And the LORD said to Moses, Go to Pharaoh: for I have hardened his heart, and the heart of his servants, that I might show My signs before him and all these signs are found on the Stele of Ah-Mose I... which for the most part has been kept hidden in the Egyptian Museum of Antiquities in Cairo that people cannot learn the truth:





- ² and you tell him directly what I worked in Egypt, and My signs I did among them; that your son and your son's son, and you know: I am the LORD.
- ³ And Moses and Aaron went to Pharaoh, and said to him, Thus says the LORD God of the Hebrews, How long will you refuse to humble yourself before Me? Let My people go, that they may serve Me;
- ⁴ or else, if you refuse to let My people go, behold, tomorrow will I bring locusts into your region:
- ⁵ and they will cover the face of the ground, that one is not able to see the ground: and they will eat the residue of what remains, what escaped the hail, and will eat every tree that grows up for you from your field:
- ⁶ And they will fill your homes, and the homes of all your servants, and the homes of all Egypt; which not your fathers or your fathers' fathers saw, since when they were on earth to this day.

And he turned, and went from Pharaoh.

⁷ And Pharaoh's servants said to him, How long will this man be a snare to us? Let the men go, to serve the LORD their God: do you not yet know that Egypt is destroyed? / all the servants and govt advisors were perplexed and must have wondered if Pharaoh Ah-Mose I... had lost his head or at the very least his mind.

⁸ And Moses and Aaron returned again to Pharaoh: and he said to them, Go, serve the LORD your God: but who will be going?

⁹ And Moses said, With our young and our old we will go, with our sons and our daughters, with our flocks and our herds we will go; for we must hold a feast to the LORD.



¹⁰ And he said to them, May the LORD be with you, as I let you and your little ones go: Beware, for evil is before you / finding his courtiers not in agreement with him, pharaoh's well wishes were phony, Ah-Mose knew full well that the labor force of Egypt was planning to leave for good.

¹¹Not so! Go now your strong men, and serve the LORD; for that is what you requested. And they were driven out from Pharaoh's presence.

¹² The LORD said to Moses, Stretch out your hand over the land of Egypt for the locusts, that they come up upon the land of Egypt, and eat every herb of the land, all that was left by the hail.

¹³ And Moses stretched out his rod over the land of Egypt, and the LORD brought an east wind on the land all that day, and all night; and when it was morning, the east wind brought the locusts.

¹⁴ And the locust went up over all the land of Egypt, and settled in all the region of Egypt: they were very grievous; there had never been so many locusts before, nor would there ever be so many again;



¹⁵ for they covered the surface of the whole land, so that the land was darkened; and they ate every herb of the land, and all the fruit of the trees which the hail had left: so not anything green trees or plants in the field remained, throughout all the land of Egypt.

¹⁶ Then Pharaoh called for Moses and Aaron in haste; and he said, I have sinned against the LORD your God, and against you.

 17 So now forgive, I pray you, my sin this one time, and plead with the LORD your God, that He take away from me this death only.

¹⁸ And he went out from Pharaoh, and plead with the LORD.

¹⁹ And the LORD turned a mighty strong west wind, which took away the locusts, and cast them into the Red Sea; and there remained not one locust in all the coasts of Egypt.

²⁰ But the LORD hardened Pharaoh's heart, so he would not let the children of Israel go.

Plague of darkness

- ²¹ And the LORD said to Moses, Stretch out your hand toward heaven, that there be darkness over the land of Egypt, even darkness which may be felt.
- ²² And Moses stretched forth his hand toward heaven; and there was a thick darkness in all the land of Egypt three days:
- ²³ they could not see one another, nor could any arise from his place for three days: but all the children of Israel had light in their dwellings.
- ²⁴ And Pharaoh called to Moses, and said, Go, serve the LORD; only let your flocks and your herds stay: let your little ones also go with you.



- ²⁵ And Moses said, You must give us also sacrifices and burnt offerings, that we may offer sacrifice to the LORD our God.
- ²⁶ Our cattle also will go with us; there will not be a hoof left behind; for of it we must take to serve the LORD our God; and we know not with what we must serve the LORD, until we come there.
- ²⁷ But the LORD hardened Pharaoh's heart, and he would not let them go.
- ²⁸ And Pharaoh said to him, Go from me, take heed to yourself, see my face no more; for in that day you see my face you will die.
- ²⁹ And Moses said, You have spoken well, I will see your face again no more.
