

The sea of Edom Is where those of Esau resettled along the Red Sea named after their father Esau whose name means; red.



<sup>1</sup> Then Moses and the children of Israel sang this song to the LORD, and spoke, saying,

I will sing to the LORD, for He has triumphed gloriously: the horse and his rider has he thrown into the sea.

<sup>2</sup> The LORD is my strength and song, and He is become my salvation: He is my God, and I will prepare Him a habitation; the God of my father, and I will exalt him.



<sup>4</sup>The chariots and armies of Pharaoh He has thrown into the sea: his chosen captains also are drowned in the Red Sea / the sea of Edom.



- <sup>5</sup> The deep covered them: they sank to the bottom like a stone.
- <sup>6</sup> Your right hand, O LORD, is become glorious in power: Your right hand, O LORD, has dashed in pieces the enemy.
- <sup>7</sup> And in the greatness of Your excellency You overthrew those who rose up against You: You sent forth Your wrath, which consumed them as stubble.

<sup>8</sup> And with the blast of Your nostrils the waters were gathered together, the floods stood upright as a heap, and the depths were congealed in the heart of the sea.

<sup>9</sup> The enemy said, I will pursue, I will overtake, I will divide the spoil; My desire will be satisfied upon them; I will draw My sword, My hand will destroy them.

<sup>10</sup> You blew with Your wind, the sea covered them: they sank like lead in the mighty waters.

<sup>11</sup> Who is like to You, O LORD, among the gods? who is like You, glorious in holiness, fearful in praises, doing wonders?



Similar to the coral structures found in the Red Sea; 4- and 6-point wheels are only from the 18th dynasty, no later than 1450 bc.

 $^{\rm 12}\,\rm You$  stretched out Your right hand, and the earth swallowed them.

<sup>13</sup> You in Your mercy led forth the people who You redeemed: You guided them in Your strength to Your holy habitation.

<sup>14</sup> The people will hear, and be afraid: sorrow will take hold on the inhabitants of Palestina.

<sup>15</sup> Then the dukes of Edom will be amazed; the mighty men of Moab, terror will take hold upon them; all the inhabitants of Canaan will melt away.

<sup>16</sup> Fear and dread will fall upon them; by the greatness of Your arm they will be as still as a stone; till Your people pass over, O LORD, till the people pass over, whom You purchased.

<sup>17</sup> You will bring them in, and plant them in the mountain of Your inheritance, in the place, O LORD, that You made, for You to dwell in, in the Sanctuary, O LORD, which Your hands established.



<sup>18</sup> The LORD will reign for ever and ever.

<sup>19</sup> For the horse of Pharaoh went with his chariots and with his horsemen into the sea, and the LORD brought again the waters of the sea upon them; but the children of Israel went on dry land in the midst of the sea.

<sup>20</sup> And Miriam the prophetess, the sister of Aaron, took a timbrel in her hand; and all the women went out after her with timbrels and with dances.

<sup>21</sup> And Miriam answered them, Sing to the LORD, for He has triumphed gloriously; the horse and his rider He has thrown into the sea.

<sup>22</sup> So Moses brought **Israel** from the **Red Sea**, and they went out into the wilderness of Shur; and they went three days in the wilderness, and found no water.

<sup>23</sup> And when they came to Marah, they could not drink of the waters of Marah, for they were bitter: therefore the name of the place was called Marah.

<sup>24</sup> And the people murmured against Moses, saying, What will we drink?

<sup>25</sup> And he cried to the LORD; and the LORD showed him a tree, which when he cast it into the waters, the waters were made sweet: there He made for them a statute and an ordinance, and there He proved them,

<sup>26</sup> And said, If You diligently listen to the voice of the LORD Your God, and do what is right in His sight, and give ear to His commandments, and keep all His statutes, I will put none of these diseases on You, which I brought on the Egyptians:

## for I am the LORD who heals you.

 $^{27}$  And they came to Elim, where were twelve water wells, and seventy palm trees: and they camped there by the water wells.
