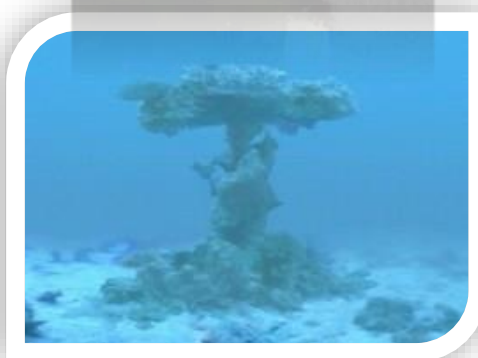
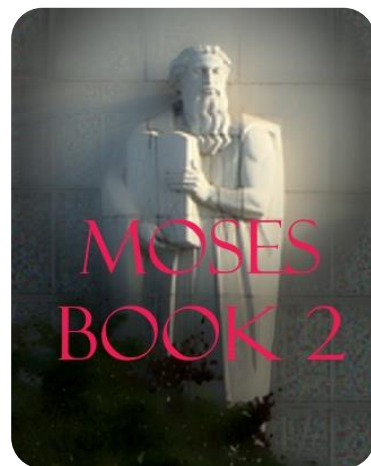
**<sup>1</sup> And they took their journey from Elim, and all the assembly of the children of Israel came to the wilderness of Sin, which is between Elim and Sinai, on the fifteenth day of the second month after they left from the land of Egypt.**

**<sup>2</sup> And the entire assembly of the children of Israel grumbled against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness:**

**<sup>3</sup> And the children of Israel said to them, If only we had died by the hand of the Lord God in the land of Egypt, when we sat by the pots of meat, and when we ate bread to the full; for you have brought us to this wilderness, to kill this whole assembly with hunger / it doesn't really sound like the words of people who were cruelly enslaved does it?**

**<sup>4</sup> Then the Lord said to Moses, Look, I will rain bread from heaven for you; and the people will go out each day and gather enough, that I may test them, whether they will walk in My law, or no.**

**<sup>5</sup> And on the sixth day, when they prepare what they bring in; and it will be twice as much as they gather daily.**

**<sup>6</sup> And Moses and Aaron said to all the children of Israel, This evening, you will know it was the Lord who brought you out of the land of Egypt:**

**<sup>7</sup> And in the morning, you will see the glory of the Lord; because He heard your complaints about Him: for who are we, what you grumble against us?**

**<sup>8</sup> And Moses said, The Lord will give you meat to eat in the evening, and all you want of bread in the morning; because the Lord heard your**

**complaints which you grumble against Him: and who are we? your complaints are not against us, but against the Lord.**

**<sup>9</sup> And Moses told Aaron, Say to all the assembly of the children of Israel, Come before the Lord: for He has heard your complaints.**

**<sup>10</sup> And it happened, as Aaron told to the whole assembly of the children of Israel, that they looked toward the wilderness, and there in the cloud the glory of the Lord appeared.**

**<sup>11</sup> And the Lord spoke to Moses, saying,**

**<sup>12</sup> I have heard the complaints of the children of Israel: speak to them, saying, At evening you will eat meat, and in the morning you will eat bread until you are filled; and you will know that I am the Lord your God.**

**<sup>13</sup> And it happened, at evening quail came, and covered the camp: and in the morning there was a layer of dew around the camp.**

**<sup>14</sup> And when the dew evaporated, Look, upon the desert surface there lay a small round flakes, as fine as the frost on the ground.**

**<sup>15</sup> And when the children of Israel saw it, they asked one to another, What is it?: because they did not know what it was. And Moses said to them, This is the bread which the Lord has given you to eat.**

**<sup>16</sup> This is what the Lord has instructed, Gather as much of it as anyone needs to eat. You may take two quarts per individual, according to the number of people each of you has in his tent.**

<sup>17</sup> **And the children of Israel did so, and gathered, some a lot, and some little.**

<sup>18</sup> And when they measured it by quarts, **the one who gathered a lot had no surplus, and the one who gathered a little had no shortage**, each gathered as much as they needed.

<sup>19</sup> **And Moses said, Let no one leave of it until the morning.**

<sup>20</sup> **Yet they did not listen to Moses**; but some of them left of it until morning, and it bred worms and stank: and Moses was angry with them.

<sup>21</sup> And they gathered it every morning, each one gathered as much as he needed to eat, but when the sun grew hot, it melted.

<sup>22</sup> **And it happened, that on the sixth day** they gathered twice as much food, four quarts for each one: and all the leaders of the assembly came and reported to Moses.

<sup>23</sup> And he said to them, This is what the Lord said, Tomorrow is the day of complete rest: the holy sabbath to the Lord: bake what you want to bake today, and boil what you will boil; and what remains set aside to be kept until the morning.

<sup>24</sup> So they set it aside until morning, as Moses instructed: and it did not stink, or have maggots in it.

<sup>25</sup> And Moses said, Eat it today; because today is a sabbath to the Lord. Today you will not find any of it in the field.

<sup>26</sup> For six days you will gather it; **but on the seventh day, the sabbath, there will be none.**

<sup>27</sup> Yet it happened, that on the seventh day some people went out to gather, but they did not find any.

<sup>28</sup> And the Lord said to Moses, How long will you refuse to keep My instructions and my laws?

<sup>29</sup> See, that the Lord has given you the sabbath, therefore on the sixth day He will give you two days' worth of bread; everyone stay in his place, let no one leave his place on the seventh day.

<sup>30</sup> **So the people rested on the seventh day.**

<sup>31</sup> And the house of Israel named it Manna. I resembled coriander seed, was white, and tasted like wafers made with honey.

<sup>32</sup> **And Moses said, This is what the Lord instructed,** Two quarts of it are to be preserved throughout your generations; that they may see the bread I fed you in the wilderness, when I brought you out of the land of Egypt.

<sup>33</sup> And Moses told Aaron, Take a container, and put two quarts of manna in it, and place it before the Lord, to be preserved for your generations.

<sup>34</sup> **As the Lord instructed Moses,**

**so Aaron placed it before the Testimony, to be preserved.**

<sup>35</sup> And the children of Israel ate manna for forty years, until they came to the border of the land of Canaan. They used the measure called an omer , which held two quarts.
