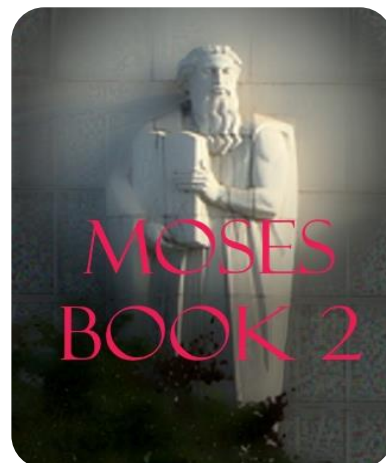


EXODUS 7 vs 1

In God's economy, He knows it may take extra time to convince Moses to keep going. The Lord, who is long-suffering and indulgent to the errors and infirmities of his people, made allowance for the indignity Moses experienced as the result of this first meeting with Pharaoh. God satisfied Moses in an answer to his complaints in the close of the previous chapter. He gives fuller instructions than previous, what to say to the children of Israel; and sent him again to Pharaoh -- Matthew Henry. In this chapter is renewed a promise God gave to Moses; and we learn of the **first plague**: 1. **Blood** in the water.



¹ And the LORD said to Moses, See, I have made you as God to Pharaoh: and Aaron your brother will be your prophet.

² You will speak all that I command you: and Aaron your brother will speak to Pharaoh, that he send the children of Israel from his land.

³ And I will harden Pharaoh's heart, and multiply My signs and My wonders in the land of Egypt;

⁴ Pharaoh will not listen to you, but I will lay My hand upon Egypt, and bring forth My hosts; My people the children of Israel, from the land of Egypt by great acts of judgment.

⁵ And the Egyptians will know I am the LORD, when I stretch out My hand against Egypt, and bring out the children of Israel from among them.

⁶ And so did Moses and Aaron just as the LORD commanded them, so did they.

⁷ Moses was eighty years old, and Aaron eighty-three years old, when they spoke to Pharaoh.

⁸ And the LORD spoke to Moses and to Aaron, saying,

⁹ when Pharaoh speaks to you, saying, You show me a miracle: then you will say to Aaron, Take your rod, and cast it before Pharaoh, and it will become a serpent.

¹⁰ So went Moses and Aaron to Pharaoh, and they did as the LORD commanded: and Aaron cast down his rod before Pharaoh, and before his servants, and it became a serpent.

¹¹ Then Pharaoh also called the wise men and the sorcerers: the magicians of Egypt, they did the same with their flashings;

¹² for they each cast down their rod, and they became serpents: but Aaron's rod swallowed up their rods.

¹³ Yet the Pharaoh's heart grew hard, that he did not listen to them; as the LORD had said.

¹⁴ And the LORD said to Moses, Pharaoh's heart is hardened, he refuses to let go the people.

¹⁵ Go to Pharaoh in the morning; lo, he goes to the water; and you will stand by the River's edge across from him; and you will take in hand the rod which was turned to a serpent.

¹⁶ And you will say to him, The LORD God of the Hebrews sent me to you, saying, Let go My people, that they may serve Me in the wilderness: but behold, till now you haven't listen.

Plague of blood

¹⁷ Thus says the LORD, By this you will know I am the LORD: behold, I will strike with the rod in my hand the water which is in the Nile River, and it will turn to **blood**.

¹⁸ And the fish in the River will die, and the River will stink; and the Egyptians will abhor drinking the water of the River.

¹⁹ And the LORD spoke to Moses, Say to Aaron, Take your rod, and stretch out your hand over the waters of Egypt, over their streams, over their rivers, and over their ponds, and over all their pools of water that they become **blood**; and that there be **blood** throughout all the land of Egypt, in both buckets of wood, and pitchers of stone.

²⁰ And so did Moses and Aaron just as the LORD commanded; and he lifted up the rod, and struck the waters that were in the River, in the sight of Pharaoh, and in the sight of his servants; and all the waters that were in the River turned to **blood**.

²¹ And the fish that were in the River died; and the River stank. So the Egyptians could not drink of the water of the River; and there was **blood** throughout all the land of Egypt.

²² But the magicians of Egypt did the same with their flashy hocus-pocus: so Pharaoh's heart was hardened, and he did not listen to them; as the LORD said.

²³ Then Pharaoh turned and went into his house, unmoved in his heart also by this.

²⁴ So dug all Egypt around the River for water to drink; because they could not drink of the water of the River.

²⁵ Seven days passed, after the LORD struck the river.
