




10 Plagues are recorded before Pharaoh finally lets the people of the Lord go. In this chapter 3 more plagues are added to the list; a list that parallels the papyrus lpuwer. And if you really think this chapter is too fantastic to believe, well then, check out the natural catastrophe at Lake NYOS in Cameroon, 1986. That sequence of plagues similarly effected those living around Lake NYOS.

- 1. The Rivers turn to blood.
- 2. Frogs come next, frogs know how to hop out of the deadly water, but they don't do well on dry land
- 3. Lice follows the frogs; frogs that hopped too far, died on the dry land; and the lice had a feast
- 4. Flies follow the lice, shortly after to also munch on the dead carcasses.



- <sup>1</sup> And the LORD spoke to Moses, Go to Pharaoh, and say to him, Thus says the LORD, Let My people go, that they may serve Me.
- <sup>2</sup> And if you refuse to let them go, behold, I will strike all your borders with frogs:
- <sup>3</sup> and the River will bring forth frogs abundantly, which will go up and enter your house, and into your bedroom, and upon your bed, and into the house of your servants, and upon your people, and into your ovens, and into your kneading bowls:
- <sup>4</sup> and the frogs will come up both on you, and on your people, and on all your servants.
- <sup>5</sup> And the LORD spoke to Moses, Say to Aaron, Stretch out your hand with your rod over the streams, the rivers, and the ponds, and cause frogs to come up upon the land of Egypt.
- <sup>6</sup> And Aaron stretched out his hand over the waters of Egypt; and the frogs came up, and covered the land of Egypt.
- <sup>7</sup> And the magicians did so with their magic, and brought up frogs upon the land of Egypt.












<sup>8</sup>Then Pharaoh called for Moses and Aaron, and said, Plead with the LORD, that He take away the frogs from me, and from my people;

and I will let the people go, that they offer sacrifice to the LORD.

<sup>9</sup> And Moses said to Pharaoh, the honor is yours to tell me: when I plead for you, for your servants, and for your people, to destroy the frogs from you and your houses, that they may remain in the river only?





And Moses said, Be it according to your word: that you may know there is no one like the LORD our God.

<sup>11</sup> And the frogs will depart from you, and from your houses, and from your servants, and from your people; they will remain in the river only.

<sup>12</sup> And Moses and Aaron went out from Pharaoh: and Moses called to the LORD because of the frogs which He brought against Pharaoh.

<sup>13</sup> And the LORD did according to the word of Moses; and the frogs died from the houses, from the villages, and from the fields;

<sup>14</sup> and they gathered them together upon heaps: and the land stank.

<sup>15</sup>But when Pharaoh saw that there was relief, he hardened his heart, and did not listen to them; as the LORD said.

#### Plaque of lice

<sup>16</sup> And the LORD said to Moses, Say to Aaron, Stretch out your rod, and strike the dust of the land, that it may become lice throughout all the land of Egypt.

<sup>17</sup> And they did so; for Aaron stretched out his hand with his rod, and struck the dust

of the earth, and it became lice on man, and on beast; and the dust of the land became lice throughout all the land of Egypt.




<sup>18</sup> And the magicians did so with their flashy hocus-pocus to bring forth lice, but they could not: so there was lice on man and beast.

<sup>19</sup> Then the magicians said to Pharaoh, This is the finger of God / and I hate to interrupt Moses, but did God really give Pharaoh AH-MOSA the finger? That Pharaoh ruled during the Hyksos expulsion (1453bc) His name means: Brother of Moses; on the Ah-Mosa Stele he writes about the Prince of the Wilderness (most likely speaking of Moses):

and Pharaoh's heart was hardened, and he did not listen to them; as the LORD had said.

<sup>20</sup> And the LORD said to Moses, Rise early in the morning, and stand before Pharaoh; lo, as he comes to the water; and say to him,

Thus says the LORD, Let go My people, that they may serve Me.



<sup>21</sup> Or else, if you will not let go My people, behold, I will send on you, and your servants, and your people, and your houses swarms of flies: and the houses of the Egyptians will be full of swarms of flies, and also the ground where they are.

<sup>22</sup> And in that day, I will separate the land of Goshen / check out the recent archeological studies done in Avaris Egypt (the Capital of the Hyksos in Goshen; those royal Semites who briefly ruled Egypt),

where My people dwell, that no swarms of flies are there; to the end that you know I am the LORD in the midst of the earth.

<sup>23</sup> And I will put a division between My people and your people: tomorrow this sign will be.

<sup>24</sup> And the LORD did so; and there came a troublesome swarm of flies into the house of Pharaoh, and into his servants' houses, and into all the land of Egypt: the land was destroyed by reason of the swarm of flies.

<sup>25</sup> And Pharaoh called for Moses and for Aaron, and said, Go offer sacrifice to your God in the land.









<sup>26</sup> But Moses said, It is not proper, for we will offer sacrifice to the LORD our God, what is an abomination to the Egyptians: lo, will we sacrifice what is abominable to the Egyptians before their eyes, and will they not stone us? / sacrificing some of their cows and sheep would have been offensive to the Egyptians, and possibly started a riot.

<sup>27</sup> We will journey three days into the wilderness, and sacrifice to the LORD our God, as He commands us.

<sup>28</sup> And Pharaoh said, I will let you go, that you offer sacrifice to the LORD your God in the wilderness; only you will not go very far away: plead for me.

<sup>29</sup> And Moses said, Behold, when I depart from you, and I will plead with the LORD that the swarms of flies depart from Pharaoh, from his servants, and from his people, tomorrow: but let not Pharaoh deal deceitfully any more in not letting the people to go sacrifice to the LORD.



<sup>30</sup> And Moses departed from Pharaoh, and pleaded with the LORD.

<sup>31</sup> And the LORD did according to the word of Moses; and He removed the swarms of flies from Pharaoh, from his servants, and from his people; there remained not one.

<sup>32</sup> And Pharaoh hardened his heart at this time also, and he would not let the people go.
