
GENESIS 24 vs 32



In this chapter, Abraham is 137 years old; and knowing his time is short Abraham is still waiting to hear the news whether or not the manager successfully found a wife for Isaac; in later chapters we will learn about the birth of Abraham's grandsons Esau and Jacob (chapter 25); and all the numerous promises of God to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob which are nationalistic promises still being fulfilled by their descendants, heirs of those promises scattered throughout the world in our 21st century.

³² And the man came into the house: and he unloaded his camels, and gave straw and feed for the camels, and water to wash his feet, and the feet of those men who were with him.



³³ And a meal was set before him to eat: but he said, I will not eat, until I have declared my errand. And he said, Speak on.

³⁴ So he said, I am Abraham's servant.

³⁵ The LORD has blessed my master greatly; and he is become great. And He has given him flocks, and herds, and silver, and gold, and menservants, and maidservants, and camels, and asses.

 36 And bore Sarah the wife of my master a son to my master when she was old: and he has given to him all that he has.

³⁷ And my master made me pledge, saying, You will not take a wife for my son from the daughters of the Canaanites, in whose land I dwell:

³⁸ But rather to the house of my father you will go, and to my kindred, and take a wife for my son.

 39 And I said to my master, Suppose the woman will not follow me.

⁴⁰ But he said to me, The Lord, before whom I walk, will send His angel with you, and prosper your way; and you will take a wife for my son of my kindred, and from the house of my father:

 41 then you will be clear from this oath, when you arrive among my kindred; if they do not give someone to you, you will be released from my oath.

⁴² And I came today to the well, and said, O LORD God of my master Abraham, if You only will now prosper my way in which I go:

- ⁴³ Behold, I stand by the well of water; and it will happen, that when the virgin comes forth to draw water, and I say to her, Give me, Please, a little water of your pitcher to drink;
- 44 And she says to me, Both you drink, and also for your camels I will draw: may she be the woman whom the LORD has appointed for the son of my master.
- ⁴⁵ But before I finished speaking in my heart, behold, Rebekah came forth with her pitcher on her shoulder; and she went down to the well, and drew water: and I said to her, Let me drink, Please.
- ⁴⁶ And she made haste, and lowered her pitcher from her shoulder, and said, Drink, and also I will give your camels to drink: so I drank, and also she made the camels drink.
- ⁴⁷ And I asked her, and said, Whose daughter are you? And she said, the daughter of Bethuel, son of Nahor, whom Milcah bore to him: so I put the ring on her nose, and bracelets on her wrists.
- ⁴⁸ And I bowed my head, and worshiped the LORD, and blessed the LORD God of my master Abraham, who led me in the true way to take the daughter of the brother of my master for his son.
- 49 And now if you will deal kindly and truly with my master, tell me: and if not, tell me; that I may turn to the right, or to the left.
- $^{50}\,\mathrm{Then}$ Laban and Bethuel answered and said, This proceeds from the LORD: so we cannot speak to you bad or good.
- 51 Behold, Rebekah is before you, take her, and go, and let her be the wife of the son of your master, as the LORD has spoken.
- 52 And it happened, when Abraham's servant heard their words, he worshiped the LORD, he bowed to the ground.
- ⁵³ And the servant brought out jewels of silver, and jewels of gold, and clothing, and gave them to Rebekah: he also gave precious things to her brother and to her mother.
- ⁵⁴ And they ate and drank, he and the men who were with him, and stayed all night; and they arose in the morning, and he said, Send me away to my master.
- 55 But her brother and her mother said, Let the girl stay with us a few days, at the least ten; after that she will go.
- 56 But he said to them, Do not hinder me, seeing the LORD has prospered my way; send me away that I may go to my master.

- 57 And they said, We will call the girl, and enquire at her mouth.
- ⁵⁸ And they called Rebekah, and said to her, Will you go with this man?

And she said, I will go.

- ⁵⁹ So they sent away Rebekah their sister, and her nurse, and Abraham's servant, and his men.
- ⁶⁰ And they blessed Rebekah, and said to her,



Our sister, you will become thousands of ten thousands, and let your offspring possess the gate of those who hate them. / and that makes you wonder where in the world did all the inheritors of Isaac and Rebecca do that, doesn't it?

- ⁶¹ And Rebekah arose, and her maidservants, and they rode on the camels, and followed the man: and the servant took Rebekah, and went his way.
- ⁶² Now Isaac came from going to Beer-lahai-roi; for he lived in the south.
- ⁶³ And Isaac went out to meditate in the field in the evening: and he lifted up his eyes, and looked, and behold, the camels were coming.
- ⁶⁴ And Rebekah lifted up her eyes, and when she saw Isaac, she dismounted from the camel.
- ⁶⁵ For she had said to the servant, Who is this man walking in the field to meet us? And the servant said, It is my master: so she took a vail and covered herself.
- ⁶⁶ And the servant told Isaac all the things he had done.
- ⁶⁷ And Isaac brought her into the tent of Sarah his mother; and he took Rebekah, and she became his wife; and he loved her; so Isaac was comforted after his mother's death.
