
## GENESIS 4 vs 1



This far, we learned: the introduction to Genesis. Chapter 1 In the beginning when God created the heaven and the earth; and all that was suitable for Adam's existence; and it was very good. <sup>1</sup> And Adam knew Eve his wife; and she conceived, and bare Cain, and said, I have gotten a man from the LORD.



- <sup>2</sup> And she again bare his brother Abel. And Abel was a keeper of sheep, but Cain was a tiller of the ground.
- <sup>3</sup> And in process of time it came to pass, that Cain brought of the fruit of the cursed ground an offering to the LORD.
- <sup>4</sup> And Abel, also brought of the firstlings of his flock and of the fat of it. And the LORD had regard for Abel and his offering:
- <sup>5</sup> but for Cain and his offering He had no regard / in the previous chapter we already learned the curse of mankind was to work the cursed ground. And Cain was very angry, and his expression fell.
- <sup>6</sup>And the LORD said to Cain, Why are you angry? and why is your face fallen?
- <sup>7</sup> If you do well, will you not be accepted? but if you do not do well, sin crouches at the door; and its desire is for you, but you must rule it.
- <sup>8</sup> And Cain told Abel his brother: and it came to pass, when they were in the field, that Cain rose up against Abel his brother, and killed him.
- <sup>9</sup> And the LORD said to Cain, Where is Abel your brother? And he said, I do not know: Am I my brother's keeper? / In other words, Am I my brother's helper? Am I supposed to take care of him?
- <sup>10</sup> And He said, What have you done? the voice of your brother's blood cries to Me from the ground.

- $^{11}\mathrm{And}$  now are you cursed from the earth, which has opened its mouth to receive your brother's blood from your hand;
- <sup>12</sup> when you till the ground, it will no longer yield its strength to you; you will be a fugitive and a wanderer on the earth.
- <sup>13</sup> And Cain said to the LORD, My punishment is too great to bear.
- <sup>14</sup>Behold, You have driven me this day from the face of the earth; and from Your face I will be hidden; and I will be a fugitive and a wanderer in the earth; and it will come to pass, that everyone who finds me will kill me.
- <sup>15</sup> So the LORD said to him, Therefore whoever slays Cain, vengeance will be taken on him sevenfold. And the LORD set a mark upon Cain, lest any finding him should kill him / and in literature, it is Beowulf that records Cain ultimately settled in what is modern Scandinavia; so was the light pigment really the mark of Cain? We do not know.
- <sup>16</sup> And Cain went out from the presence of the LORD, and dwelt in the land of Nod, east of Eden.
- <sup>17</sup> And Cain knew his wife; and she conceived, and bare Enoch: and he built a city, and called the name of the city, after the name of his son, Enoch.
- $^{18}\,\mathrm{Now}$  to Enoch was born Irad: and Irad begat Mehujael: and Mehujael begat Methushael: and Methushael begat Lamech.
- <sup>19</sup> And Lamech took to him two wives: the name of the one was Adah, and the name of the other Zillah / this is the first one to deviate from the Lord's plan of one man for one woman.
- <sup>20</sup> And Adah bare Jabal: he was the father of those who dwell in tents, and have cattle.
- <sup>21</sup> And his brother's name was Jubal: he was the father of all those who play the harp and pipe.
- <sup>22</sup> And Zillah, she also bare Tubal-cain, a forger of every implement of brass and iron: and the sister of Tubal-cain was Naamah / and all these names survive in secret occult societies today.
- <sup>23</sup> And Lamech said to his wives, Adah and Zillah, Hear my voice; you wives of Lamech, listen to my speech: for I have killed a man for wounding me, and a boy for striking me.

<sup>24</sup> If Cain will be avenged sevenfold,

## truly Lamech seventy-sevenfold.

<sup>25</sup> And Adam knew his wife again; and she bare a son, and called his name Seth: she said, For God has appointed me another offspring in place of Abel, whom Cain killed.

<sup>26</sup> And to Seth, to him also there was born a son; and he called his name Enos: then began men to call upon the name of the LORD.
