Isaiah was instructed of the LORD to address all the major actors, even those who made a covenant with death and lies, and hell... people so evil they would murder their own children... even till the time of the end of the Gentile nations. Now in focus is the leftovers of a faithless commonwealth led by royal Ephraim; when Messiah comes in power and great glory to set things right... with a cataclysmic event the whole world will know He is on the way.

Check His calendar... Moses fully told us about it: 7 specific workdays for the LORD; 4 days, shadows of things to come are done leaving 3 specific days – the last days at the time of the Harvest yet to be fulfilled.



An Oracle Concerning Tyre and Sidon; and Tarshish, too!

¹ The Oracle of Tyre.

Wail / groan, O ships of Tarshish for it is destroyed so that there is no haven, no entering in from the land of Chittim / whose ships are these? Some analysts insist this verse is merely talking about ships of Tyre that traded commodities with Tarshish; not ships belonging to Tarshish. I disagree. They were and still are the merchants of the world; descendants of Joseph's 2 sons ½ Egyptian brothers: Ephraim leader of the commonwealth of Israel, Tarshish is identified with Gibraltar; destruction came to Tyre; foreshadowing the final commercial destruction | without house or harbor; often identified with Cypress. The ancient Syriac Bible identifies them; from the land of China it is reported to them.

²Be still, O residents of the isle; you whom the merchants of Sidon, that cross the sea, have replenished / have filled up; and who is this island? Most bible commentators assume it is the coastal region of Lebanon, but again I disagree. Remember the first to wail and moan are the ships of Tarshish.

Later in this book, Isaiah will talk about Israel in the Islands; world merchants who associated with the Phoenicians of Tyre; who traded with Carthage of North Africa and regions beyond... evidence showing all the way to the indigenous peoples of modern day Michigan in north America.

³ And on many waters, the grain of Sihor - harvest of the Nile River delta, is your revenue; and you were the market of nations / Tyre was the epicenter for the merchants of the world.

⁴O Sidon / most ancient, mother-city north of Tyre, be ashamed; for the sea has spoken / and is that the sea of humanity speaking? even the stronghold of the sea saying,

I have not been in labor, I have not given birth, I have not raised young men, or brought up young women / Tyre herself, she who once was so fruitful among her colonies; sending her armies of merchants and suppliers and agents to far flung places of the earth, now she declares she is childless; she is barren and desolate; she only cared about herself.

- ⁵ When news of Tyre reaches Egypt, they will be in great agony.
- ⁶Cross over to Tarshish; Wail / groan, O residents of the isle.
- ⁷Is this your joyous city, whose origin was from ancient days? whose feet took her to live far off.
- ⁸ Who decided this against Tyre, the crowning city, whose merchants are rulers whose traffickers are the honored of the earth?/ rulers likely criminals; drug traffickers? human traffickers? child traffickers? sounds like those in our time, doesn't it?
- ⁹The LORD of hosts planned it, to defile the pride of all boasting, and to dishonor / to make despicable, all the honored of the earth.
- ¹⁰ Overflow your land like the Nile, O daughter of Tarshish: nothing restrains you.
- ¹¹ He stretched out His hand over the sea of humanity, He shook the realms: the LORD has given a command concerning Canaan to demolish its strongholds.
- And He said, You will not celebrate any longer, O crushed virgin daughter of Sidon: Arise, pass over to China; there also you will find no rest / there is no rest for those criminals who do evil; the Lord will chase them down and find them.
- ¹³ Look, the land of the Chaldeans − now, a trivial people / with their own hands they built the foundation and walls and towers and palaces of Babylon; yet the Assyrians brought it to ruin; so likewise, Tyre will be ruined − Matthew Henry;

Assyria destined it for wild beasts; they set up its siege towers, they stripped its palaces; and brought it to ruin / Assyria destroyed it, they made it a place for all the desert creatures, every slimy reptile, every lizard and snake:

¹⁴ Wail, O ships of Tarshish: for your stronghold is laid waste / your fabled city, your greatest business partner is destroyed.

¹⁵ And on that day, it will happen, that Tyre will be forgotten for seventy years, like the days of one king / the span of a good king's life.

At the end of seventy years, Tyre will be like what the song says of a whore; / her memory will be like some popular ballad or country western ode:

¹⁶ Take a guitar, stroll about the city, O ignored whore! Make sweet melody, sing many songs, so you are remembered.

¹⁷ At the end of seventy years, the LORD will restore Tyre; then she will return to hire herself out prostituting with all the realms of the world on the surface of the earth / she will return to her very lucrative practice, doing what whores do best.

¹⁸ Her proceeds and wages will be wholly to the LORD; they will not be stored, or hoarded but her proceeds will provide sufficient food and fine clothing for those who dwell in the presence of the LORD. / the merchants were not to fill their own coffers, but to expend their wealth wisely and faithfully; to be applied to assist the relief of teachers of the word, the foreigner among us, the widow, the fatherless and the poor among the people of God, and other similar purposes;
