JOB 15 vs 1



Little is known about Job, but what we do know it that Job was a real person -- mentioned in Ezekiel 14; and James 5. To help us understand what speculative wisdom was being exchanged among these 4 friends, I went to the end of the book, to hear its conclusion, and we read: the LORD said to Eliphaz the Temanite, My anger is ignited against you, and against your two friends: for you have not spoken of Me what is right, as My servant Job has. These 4 friends were clueless to what brought them together; so their guesses and rumors run freely through the pages dressed in friendship.



Eliphaz Accuses Job of Folly,

- ¹ Then Eliphaz the Temanite answered and said:
- ²Should a wise man answer with empty knowledge, And fill himself with the east wind?
- ³ Should he reason with pointless talk, or by speeches with which he can do no good?
- ⁴Yes, you throw off fear, And restrain prayer before God.
- ⁵ For your crime teaches your mouth, And you choose the tongue of the crafty.
- ⁶ Your own mouth condemns you, and not I; Yes, your own lips testify against you.
- ⁷ Are you the first man who was born? Or were you made before the hills?
- ⁸ Have you heard the counsel of God? Do you limit wisdom to yourself?
- ⁹ What do you know that we do not know? What do you understand that is not in us?/ they seem to say the same obvious things to each other, I know that, too, I wasn't born yesterday, they sound no different than the bird brains and peanut heads of our genius 21st century.
- $^{10}\,\mathrm{Both}$ the gray-haired and the aged are among us, Much older than your father.
- ¹¹ Are the consolations of God too small for you, And the word spoken gently with you?
- $^{\rm 12}\,\mbox{Why}$ does your heart carry you away, And what do your eyes wink at,
- ¹³ That you turn your spirit against God, And let such words go out of your mouth?
- ¹⁴ What is man, that he could be pure? And he who is born of a woman, that he could be right?

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- ¹⁵ If God puts no trust in His saints, And the heavens are not pure in His sight,
- ¹⁶ How much less man, who is abominable and filthy, Who drinks crime like water!
- ¹⁷ I will tell you, hear me; what I have seen I will declare,
- ¹⁸ what wise men have told, Not hiding anything received from their fathers,
- ¹⁹ To whom alone the land was given, And no foreigner passed among them:
- ²⁰ the wicked man writhes with pain all his days, And the number of years is hid from the oppressor.
- ²¹ Dreadful sounds are in his ears; In prosperity the destroyer comes upon him.
- ²² He does not believe that he will return from darkness, for a sword is waiting for him.
- ²³ He wanders about for bread, saying, Where is it? He knows that a day of darkness is ready at his hand.
- ²⁴ Trouble and anguish make him afraid; They overpower him, like a king ready for battle.
- ²⁵ For he stretches out his hand against God, and acts defiantly against the Almighty,
- ²⁶ Running stubbornly against Him With his strong, embossed shield.
- 27 Though he covered his face with his fatness, And made his waist heavy with fat,
- ²⁸He dwells in desolate cities, In houses which no one inhabits, which are destined to become ruins.
- ²⁹ He will not be rich, Nor his wealth continue, Nor his possessions overspread the earth.
- 30 He will not depart from darkness; The flame will dry out his branches, and by the breath of His mouth he will go away.
- ³¹ Let him not trust in futile things, deceiving himself, For futility will be his reward.
- 32 It will be accomplished before his time, And his branch will not be green.
- 33 He will shake off his unripe grape like a vine, And throw off his blossom like an olive tree.
- ³⁴ For the company of hypocrites will be barren, And fire will consume the tents of bribery.
