
## **JOB 18 vs 1**

- $^{10}\,\mathrm{A}$  noose is hidden for him on the ground, And a trap for him in the road.
- <sup>11</sup> Terrors frighten him on every side, And drive him to his feet.
- $^{12}$  His strength is starved, and destruction is ready at his side.
- <sup>13</sup> It devours patches of his skin; the firstborn of death devours his limbs.
- <sup>14</sup>He is uprooted from the shelter of his tent, And they parade him before the king of terrors.

<sup>15</sup> They dwell in his tent who are none of his; Brimstone is scattered on his dwelling.

<sup>16</sup> His roots are dried out below, and his branch withers above.

<sup>17</sup> The memory of him perishes from the earth, and he has no name among the renowned.

<sup>18</sup> He is driven from light into darkness, And chased out of the world.

<sup>19</sup> He has neither son nor posterity among his people, Nor any remaining in his dwellings.

<sup>20</sup> Those in the west are astonished at his day, As those in the east are frightened.

<sup>21</sup> Surely such are the dwellings of the wicked, And this is the place of him who does not know God.
