Job's Discourse on the Wicked.

- ¹ Then Job answered and said:
- ² Listen carefully to my speech, And let this be your consolation.
- ³Bear with me that I may speak, and after I have spoken, keep mocking.
- ⁴ As for me, is my complaint against man? And if it were, why should I not be impatient?
- ⁵ Look at me and be astonished; Put your hand over your mouth.
- ⁶ Even when I remember I am terrified, And trembling takes hold of my flesh.
- ⁷ Why do the wicked live and become old, Yes, become mighty in power?
- ⁸ Their descendants are established with them in their sight, And their offspring before their eyes.
- 9 Their houses are safe from fear, nor is the rod of God upon them.
- 10 Their bull breeds without failure; their cow calves without miscarriage.
- 11 They send forth their little ones like a flock, And their children dance.
- 12 They sing to the tambourine and harp, And rejoice to the sound of the flute.
- ¹³ They spend their days in wealth, And in a moment go down to the grave.



- Yet they say to God, Depart from us, For we do not desire the knowledge of Your ways.
- ¹⁵Who is the Almighty, that we should serve Him? And what profit do we have if we pray to Him?
- ¹⁶ Indeed their prosperity is not in their hand; the counsel of the wicked is far from me.
- 17 How often is the lamp of the wicked put out? How often does their destruction come upon them, The sorrows God distributes in His anger?
- ¹⁸ They are like straw before the wind, And like chaff that a storm carries away.
- ¹⁹ They say, God lays up one's crime for his children; Let Him repay him, that he may know it.
- ²⁰ Let his eyes see his destruction, And let him drink of the wrath of the Almighty.
- ²¹ For what does he care about his household after him, When the number of his months is cut in half?
- ²² Can anyone teach God knowledge, Since He judges those on high?
- ²³ One dies in his full strength, being wholly at ease and secure;
- $^{24}\,\mbox{His}$ pails are full of milk, And the marrow of his bones is moist.
- ²⁵ Another man dies in the bitterness of his soul, Never having eaten with pleasure.
- ²⁶ They lie down alike in the dust, And worms cover them.
- ²⁷ Look, I know your thoughts, And the schemes with which you would wrong me.
- ²⁸ For you say, Where is the house of the prince?

And where is the tent, The dwelling place of the wicked?

- ²⁹ Have you not asked those who travel the road? And do you not know their signs?
- 30 For the wicked are reserved for the day of doom; They will be brought out on the day of wrath.
- ³¹ Who condemns his way to his face? And who repays him for what he has done?
