## JOB 22 vs 1



Little is known about Job, but what we do know it that Job was a real person -- mentioned in Ezekiel 14; and James 5. To help us understand what speculative wisdom was being exchanged among these 4 friends, I went to the end of the book, to hear its conclusion, and we read: the LORD said to Eliphaz the Temanite, My anger is ignited against you, and against your two friends: for you have not spoken of Me what is right, as My servant Job has. These 4 friends were clueless to what brought them together; so their guesses and rumors run freely through the pages dressed in friendship.



Eliphaz Accuses Job of Wickedness,

- <sup>1</sup> Then Eliphaz the Temanite answered and said:
- <sup>2</sup> Can a man be profitable to God, Though he who is wise may be profitable to himself?
- <sup>3</sup> Is it any pleasure to the Almighty that you are right? Or is it gain to Him that you make your ways blameless?
- <sup>4</sup> Is it because of your fear of Him that He corrects you, And enters into judgment with you?
- <sup>5</sup> Is not your wickedness great, And your crime without end?
- <sup>6</sup>For you have taken pledges from your brother for no reason, And stripped the naked of their clothing.
- <sup>7</sup>You have not given the weary water to drink, And you have withheld bread from the hungry.
- <sup>8</sup> But the mighty man possessed the land, And the honorable man dwelt in it.
- <sup>9</sup>You have sent widows away empty, And the strength of the fatherless was crushed.
- <sup>10</sup> So snares are all around you, And sudden fear troubles you,
- <sup>11</sup>Or darkness so that you cannot see; And an abundance of water covers you. / Eliphaz was sure Job must have done something that angered God.
- <sup>12</sup> Is not God in the height of heaven? And see the highest stars, how lofty they are!
- <sup>13</sup> And you say, What does God know? Can He judge through the deep darkness?



- <sup>14</sup> Thick clouds cover Him, so that He cannot see, And He walks above the circle of heaven.
- <sup>15</sup> Will you keep to the old way which wrongdoers have trod,
- <sup>16</sup> Who were cut down before their time, Whose foundations were swept away by a flood?
- <sup>17</sup> They said to God, Depart from us! What can the Almighty do to them?
- <sup>18</sup> Yet He filled their houses with good things; But the counsel of the wicked is far from me.
- <sup>19</sup> The righteous see it and are glad, And the innocent laugh at them:
- <sup>20</sup> Surely our adversaries are cut down, And the fire consumes their remnant.
- <sup>21</sup> Now acquaint yourself with Him, and be at peace; Thereby good will come to you.
- <sup>22</sup> Receive, please, instruction from His mouth, And lay up His words in your heart.
- <sup>23</sup> If you return to the Almighty, you will be built up; You will remove crime far from your tents.
- <sup>24</sup> Then you will lay your gold in the dust, And the gold of Ophir among the stones of the brooks.
- <sup>25</sup> Yes, the Almighty will be your gold And your precious silver;
- $^{26}$  for then you will have your delight in the Almighty, And lift up your face to God.
- $^{27}$  You will make your prayer to Him, He will hear you, And you will pay your vows.
- <sup>28</sup> You will also declare a thing, And it will be established for you; So light will shine on your ways.
- <sup>29</sup> When they throw you down, and you say, Exaltation will come! Then He will save the humble person.
- $^{30}$  He will even deliver one who is not innocent; Yes, He will be delivered by the cleanness of your hands.

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
