These 4 friends were clueless to what brought them together; so their guesses and rumors run freely through the pages dressed in friendship.



Elihu Contradicts Job,

- ¹ But please, Job, hear my speech, And listen to all my words.
- ² Now, I open my mouth; My tongue speaks in my mouth.
- ³ My words come from my upright heart; my lips utter clean knowledge.
- ⁴ The Spirit of God has made me, And the breath of the Almighty gives me life.
- ⁵ If you can answer me, Set your words in order before me; Take your stand.
- ⁶ Truly I am as your spokesman before God; I also have been formed out of clay.
- ⁷ Surely no fear of me will terrify you, Nor will my hand be heavy on you.
- ⁸ Surely you have spoken in my hearing, And I have heard the sound of your words, saying,
- ⁹ 'I am clean, without stepping over the line; I am innocent, and there is no crime in me.
- ¹⁰ Yet He finds occasions against me, He counts me as His enemy;
- ¹¹ He puts my feet in the stocks, He watches all my paths.
- ¹² Look, in this you are not right. I will answer you, For God is greater than man.
- ¹³ Why do you contend with Him? For He does not give an accounting of any of His words.
- ¹⁴ For God may speak in one way, or in another, Yet man does not perceive it.
- ¹⁵ In a dream, in a vision of the night, when deep sleep falls upon men, while slumbering on their beds,



- ¹⁶ Then He opens the ears of men, And seals their instruction.
- ¹⁷ In order to turn man from his deed, And conceal pride from man,
- ¹⁸ He keeps back his soul from the Pit, And his life from perishing by the sword.
- ¹⁹ Man is also chastened with pain on his bed, And with strong pain in many of his bones,
- ²⁰ So that his life abhors bread, And his soul succulent food.
- ²¹ His flesh wastes away from sight, And his bones stick out which once were not seen.
- ²² Yes, his soul draws near the Pit, And his life to the executioners.
- ²³ If there is a messenger for him, A mediator, one among a thousand, To show man He is upright,
- ²⁴ Then He is gracious to him, and says, Deliver him from going down to the Pit; I have found a ransom;
- ²⁵ His flesh will be young like a child's, He will return to the days of his youth.
- 26 He will pray to God, and He will delight in him, He will see His face with joy, For He restores to man His rightness.
- ²⁷ Then he looks at men and says, I have sinned, and perverted what was right, And it did not profit me.
- ²⁸ He will redeem his soul from going down to the Pit, And his life will see the light.
- 29 Behold, God works all these things, twice, in fact, three times with a man,
- 30 To bring back his soul from the Pit, that he may be enlightened with the light of life.
- ³¹ Give ear, Job, listen to me; Hold your peace, and I will speak.
- ³² If you have anything to say, answer me; Speak, for I desire to justify you.
- ³³ If not, listen to me; Hold your peace, and I will teach you wisdom.
