JOB 40 vs 1



Little is known about the man who names this book, but a few things we do know, beginning with Job was a real person (mentioned in Ezekiel 14; and James 5). Some scholars suggest this is merely an allegory or possibly an ancient; either way it mentions things that were more clearly understood in the 20th century. Whoever Job was, he knew celestial things; he know terrestrial things; even things that suggest he lived concurrent to massive dinosaurs. The detailed conversations throughout this book, suggest real speeches inscribed shortly after the event, rather than what any poetic artist would write.

- ¹ Then the LORD answered Job, and said,
- ² will critics, contend with the Almighty? he who argues with God, let him answer / remember, there are 4 others listening to all these questions the Lord just put forth; and I bet they sat there paying attention very quiet:
- ³ Then Job answered the LORD, and said, / then this very elegant business man, got up very much awake and what was the first thing he said?
- ⁴ Behold, I am vile; how can I answer You? Instead, I will cover my mouth with my hand.
- ⁵ I have spoken once; but I will not answer: yes, twice; but I will add nothing more.
- ⁶ Then the LORD answered Job from the whirlwind, and said,
- ⁷ Get ready to answer like a man: when I question you, you will inform Me.
- ⁸ Will you really discredit My justice? will you condemn Me, to justify yourself?
- ⁹ Do you have an arm like God; can you thunder with a voice like His,
- ¹⁰ Adorn yourself with majesty and excellency; and clothe yourself with honor and glory.
- ¹¹ Pour out your raging anger: look on every proud person and humiliate him.
- ¹² Look on every proud person, and humble him; trample the wrongdoer where they stand.
- ¹³ Hide them together in the dust; cover them in darkness.
- 14 Then I will offer praise to you because your own right hand can save you.

²⁰ Surely the hills yield him food, where all kinds of animals play there.
