¹ But it exceedingly displeased Jonah, and he was very angry.

⁷But when dawn came the next day, God had prepared a worm and it attacked the plant and it withered.

⁸ And it happened, when the sun was rising, God prepared a scorching east wind; and the sun beat down on the head of Jonah, that he became faint, and wanted to die.

And he said, It is better for me to die than to live.

⁹ And God asked Jonah, Is it well for you to be angry about the plant? And he said, I do well to be angry, enough to die.



¹⁰ Then the LORD said, You had compassion on the plant, for which you did not labor, nor made it grow; which came up in a night, and perished in a night:

¹¹ And should I not spare Nineveh, that great city, wherein are more than 120,000 children who cannot discern between their right and their left; and also many animals? / and here. God says to Jonah, just because you don't like the Gentiles doesn't mean I don't love them.
