The book of Joshua, written around 1453bc, describes the conquest of Israel over the land promised to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob; now entering the land occupied by 7 different pagan cultures. Leading the people, was Joshua, whose name means: The Lord is salvation.

The Kings Conquered by Moses

¹ Those of **Israel** defeated the following kings, and took possession of their land on the other side of the Jordan to the east, from the Arnon River to Mount Hermon, and all the eastern Arabah:



² King Sihon of the Amorites, who lived in Heshbon and ruled half of Gilead, from Aroer on the bank of the River Arnon, along the middle of that valley, to the Jabbok River -- the border of the Ammonites,

³ the Arabah east of the Sea of Chinneroth to the Arabah -- the Dead Sea, east through Beth-Jeshimoth, and south below the slopes of Pisgah.

⁴ King Og of Bashan, who was of the remnant of the giants, lived in Ashtaroth at Edrei.

⁵ He ruled over Mount Hermon, Salecah, all Bashan, as far as the border of the Geshurites and Maachathites, and over half of Gilead to the border of King Sihon of Heshbon.

⁶ Moses the servant of the Lord and all **Israel** conquered them; and Moses the servant of the Lord gave their land as an inheritance to the Reubenites, Gadites, and half the tribe of Manasseh.

The Kings Conquered by Joshua,

⁷Joshua and the children of Israel conquered all these kings of the hill country to the west of the Jordan River, from Baal-Gad in the Valley of Lebanon to Mount Halak and the ascent to Seir -- Joshua gave to the tribes of Israel as an inheritance according to their allotments,
