JOSHUA 14 vs 1



The book of Joshua, written around 1453bc, describes the conquest of Israel over the land promised to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob; now entering the land occupied by 7 different pagan cultures. Leading the people, was Joshua, whose name means: The Lord is salvation.

The Land Divided West of the Jordan.

- ¹ Those of Israel received their portion as Eleazar the priest, Joshua the son of Nun, and the family heads of the tribes of Israel gave them in the land of Canaan.
- ² Their inheritance was by lot, as the Lord instructed by the hand of Moses, for the nine tribes and the half-tribe.



- ³ Because Moses had given the inheritance of the two tribes and the half-tribe on the other side of the Jordan; but he gave no inheritance among them to the Levites.
- ⁴ For the children of Joseph were two tribes: Manasseh and Ephraim. And they gave no part to the Levites in the land, except cities to dwell in, with their common-lands for their livestock and their property. / the two sons of Joseph were greatly blessed, the younger son Ephraim received all the promises given to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.
- ⁵ As the Lord had instructed Moses, so the children of Israel did; and they divided the land.

Caleb Inherits Hebron.

- ⁶Then the children of Judah came to Joshua in Gilgal. And Caleb the son of Jephunneh the Kenizzite said to him: You know the word which the Lord said to Moses the man of God concerning you and me in Kadesh Barnea.
- ⁷I was forty years old when Moses the servant of the Lord sent me from Kadesh Barnea to spy out the land, and I brought back word to him as it was in my heart.
- ⁸ However my brothers who went up with me, caused the people to lose heart, but I followed the Lord my God completely.
- ⁹So on that day, Moses swore to me, saying, Surely the land where you set foot will be your inheritance, and your descendant's forever, because you followed the Lord my God completely.

¹⁰ And now, behold, the Lord has kept me alive, as He said, these forty-five years, ever since the Lord spoke this word to Moses while **Israel** wandered in the wilderness; and now, here I am this day, eighty-five years old.

¹¹ yet I am as strong this day as when Moses sent me; just as my strength was then, so now is my strength for war, both for going out and for coming in.

¹² So now, give me this mountain the Lord promised that day; for you heard in that day how the Anakim were there, and that the cities were great and fortified. It may be that the Lord will be with me, and I will be able to drive them out as the Lord said.

¹³ So Joshua blessed him, and gave Hebron to Caleb the son of Jephunneh as an inheritance.

¹⁴Hebron became the inheritance of Caleb the son of Jephunneh the Kenizzite to this day, because he wholly followed the Lord God of Israel.

¹⁵ The name of Hebron in the past was Kirjath Arba -- Arba was the greatest man among the Anakim. After this the land had rest from war.
