


The book of Leviticus ends with building the first temple in Jerusalem. More than 50 times in this book, we read the Lord spoke to Moses; and they built the temple according to the pattern God gave to Moses. And what is written here is for the benefit of all Israel, literally all who are ruled by God.

¹And the Lord spoke to Moses, saying,

² Speak to all the congregation of the children of Israel, and say to them,

You will be holy: for I the Lord your God am holy / Jesus the Messiah, reminded the people, His Father wasn't lowering expectations.

³Each one of you will fear his mother and father, and keep My sabbaths / guard My sacred days of joyous rest and reflection:



I am the Lord your God.

⁴Do not turn to idols, nor make molten images of gods for yourselves:

I am the Lord your God.

⁵ And if you sacrifice a peace offering to the Lord, you will offer it, that you are accepted.

⁶ It will be eaten on the same day you offer it, and on the next day: but what remains until the third day, it will be burned in the fire.

⁷ And if it is eaten at all on the third day, it is disgusting; it will not be accepted.

⁸ And anyone who eats it will bear his iniquity, because he has profaned what is sacred to the Lord: and that person will be cut off from his people.

⁹ And when you reap the harvest of your land, you will not reap to the very edge of your field, nor will you gather the grains or other things left of your harvest.

 10 And you will not glean your vineyard, nor will you gather every fallen grape of your vineyard; you will kindly leave them for the poor and foreigner:

I am the Lord your God.

¹¹ You will not steal, nor deal falsely, nor lie one to another.



¹² And you will not swear falsely by My name, nor will you profane the name of your God:

I am the Lord.

- You will not defraud your neighbor, nor steal from him: the wages due the one you hired will not stay with you all night until morning / so pay that one immediately for their finished work.
- ¹⁴ You will not curse the deaf, nor cause the blind to stumble, but you will fear your God:

I am the Lord.

- ¹⁵ You will not act unjustly in judgment: you will not be partial to the poor, nor defer to the rich: but in equity you will judge your neighbor.
- ¹⁶ Do not spread stories among the people: do not stay silent and endanger your neighbor;

I am the Lord.

- ¹⁷ You will not hate your brother in your heart. Rebuke your neighbor, but do not incur sin because of him.
- ¹⁸ Do not take revenge, or bear a grudge against your people, but love your neighbor as yourself:

I am the Lord.

- ¹⁹ You are to keep My statutes. You will not crossbreed two kinds of your cattle: you will not sow your fields with two kinds of seed: nor wear a garment of two kinds of materials.
- ²⁰ Whoever has sexual relations with a woman, who is a slave committed to a husband, and has not been redeemed, nor given her freedom; they will be punished; but they will not be put to death, because she had not been freed.
- ²¹ However, he will bring his guilt offering to the Lord, at the entrance to the tent of the assembly, even a ram for his restitution.
- ²² And the priest will make atonement for him before the Lord, with the ram of the guilt offering for the sin he committed: and the sin which he did will be forgiven him.
- And when you enter the land, and plant all kinds of trees for food, then you will count the fruit as forbidden. Three years it will be forbidden for you: it is not to be eaten.



- ²⁴But in the fourth year, all its fruit will be holy, an offering of praise to the Lord.
- ²⁵ And in the fifth year, you can eat its fruit, that its yield may increase to you: I am the Lord your God.
- ²⁶ Do not to eat anything with blood in it: you are not to practice divination, nor practice
- ²⁷ You are not to round the side-growth of your head, nor mar the edge of your beard.
- ²⁸ You are not to make any gashes on your body for the dead; nor mark yourself with tattoos:

I am the Lord.

- ²⁹ Do not traffic your daughter to make her a whore; lest the whole land fall into depravity, and the land become full of lewdness.
- ³⁰ You will keep my sabbaths, and revere My sanctuary:

I am the Lord.

³¹ Do not regard those with demons, nor consult mediums, or you will be defiled by them:

I am the Lord your God.

 32 You are to rise in the presence of the elders, and honor the old man, and fear your God:

I am the Lord.

- ³³ And if a stranger resides with you in your land, you will not harass him.
- ³⁴But the stranger who remains with you, will be to you as a native-born among you, and vou will love him as yourself; for you were strangers in the land of Egypt:

I am the Lord your God.

- ³⁵ You are to do no wrong in judgment, in measuring of length, of weight, or capacity.
- ³⁶You are to have correct balances, correct weights, a correct ephah, and a correct hin:



I am the Lord your God, who brought you from the land of Egypt.

³⁷Therefore will you observe all My statutes, and all My judgments, and do them:

I am the Lord.
