

# LEVITICUS 1 vs 1

The book of Leviticus ends with building the first temple in Jerusalem. More than 50 times in this book, we read the Lord spoke to Moses; and they built the temple according to the pattern God gave to Moses. And what is written here is for the benefit of all Israel, literally all who are ruled by God.

The Burnt Offering,

**<sup>1</sup>Now the Lord called to Moses, and spoke to him from the Tent of meeting, saying, <sup>2</sup>Speak to the children of Israel, and say to them: ‘When any one of you brings an offering to the Lord, you will bring your offering of the livestock -- of the herd and of the flock.**

**If his offering is a burnt sacrifice of the herd, let him offer a male without blemish; he will offer it of his own free will at the door of the Tent of meeting before the Lord. <sup>4</sup>Then he will put his hand on the head of the burnt offering, and it will be accepted on his behalf to make atonement for him. <sup>5</sup>He will kill the bull before the Lord; and the priests, Aaron’s sons, will bring the blood and sprinkle the blood all around on the altar that is by the door of the Tent of meeting. <sup>6</sup>And he will skin the burnt offering and cut it into its pieces. <sup>7</sup>The sons of Aaron the priest will put fire on the altar, and lay the wood in order on the fire. <sup>8</sup>Then the priests, Aaron’s sons, will lay the parts, the head, and the fat in order on the wood that is on the fire upon the altar; <sup>9</sup>but he will wash its entrails and its legs with water. And the priest will burn all on the altar as a burnt sacrifice, an offering made by fire, a sweet aroma to the Lord.**

**<sup>10</sup>‘If his offering is of the flocks -- of the sheep or of the goats -- as a burnt sacrifice, he will bring a male without blemish. <sup>11</sup>He will kill it on the north side of the altar before the Lord; and the priests, Aaron’s sons, will sprinkle its blood all around on the altar. <sup>12</sup>And he will cut it into its pieces, with its head and its fat; and the priest will lay them in order on the wood that is on the fire upon the altar; <sup>13</sup>but he will wash the entrails and the legs with water. Then the priest will bring it all and burn it on the altar; it is a burnt sacrifice, an offering made by fire, a sweet aroma to the Lord.**

**<sup>14</sup>‘And if the burnt sacrifice of his offering to the Lord is of birds, then he will bring his offering of turtledoves or young pigeons. <sup>15</sup>The priest will bring it to the altar, wring off its head, and burn it on the altar; its blood will be drained out at the side of the altar. <sup>16</sup>And he will remove its crop with its feathers and cast it beside the altar on the east side, into the place for ashes. <sup>17</sup>Then he will split it at its wings, but will not divide it completely; and the priest will burn it on the altar, on the wood that is on the fire. It is a burnt sacrifice, an offering made by fire, a sweet aroma to the Lord.**
