
LUKE 17 vs 5



In the previous part of the chapter, Luke recalls when the disciples of Jesus came to Him with many questions, as they attempted to put together all they were taught, and how they need to change their thinking about somethings, because without a change mind there would be no changed heart.

- ⁵ And the apostles said to the Lord, Increase our faith. / help our faith to grow.
- ⁶ And the Lord said, If you had faith the size of a mustard seed, you can say to this sycamore tree, Be uprooted, and planted in the sea; and it will obey you.



- ⁷But which one of you, having a servant plowing or tending the cattle, will say to him when he comes from the field, Go and sit down to eat?
- ⁸ Instead will he not say to him, Prepare something for me to eat, get ready and serve me, while I eat and drink; and later you can eat and drink?
- ⁹ Does he thank the servant because he did what he was asked of him? I don't think so.
- 10 So in the same way, when you have done all that you are instructed, say, at best we are good-for-nothing servants: we have done what was our duty.

10 men healed.

- ¹¹ And it happened, as He went to Jerusalem, that He passed between Samaria and Galilee.
- 12 and as He entered a certain village, there, 10 men who had a skin disease met Him / they were lepers, who stood at a distance:
- 13 and they lifted up their voices / probably very eagerly, and said, Jesus, Master, have mercy on us.
- ¹⁴ And when He saw them, He said to them, Go show yourselves to the priests. And it happened, that as they went / having heard His instruction, they obeyed, they were cleansed.
- ¹⁵ But one of them, when he noticed he was healed, turned around, and with a loud voice shouted glory to God,
- 16 and falling down on his face at His feet, giving Him thanks: and he was a Samaritan.
- ¹⁷ And Jesus responded, and said, Were not ten cleansed? So where are the nine?

¹⁸ Did no one else returned to give glory to God, except this foreigner?

¹⁹ And he said to him, Arise, go your way: your faith has made you whole.

Concerning the Kingdom of God,

²⁰ And having been questioned by the Pharisees, when the kingdom of God should come, He answered and said, The kingdom of God is not coming with something observable:

²¹ nor will they say, Look here! or there! for you see the kingdom of God is among you.



²² And He said to the disciples, The days will come, when you will long to see one of the days of the Son of Man, and will not see it / Moses told us about the 7 Days of the Lord; and though 4 of His days – the first days were fulfilled when He walked among us; but He had work to do building His church, and now 2000 years later we know 3 days – shadows of things to come, are still on His calendar, and the 3 last days find meaning related to something the Messiah intends to do.

²³ And they will say to you, Look here; or look there: do not go after them, nor follow them.

²⁴ For as the lightning, when it flashes from one part of the sky, shines to the other part of the sky; so also the Son of Man will in His day. / nobody will miss seeing Him.

²⁵ But first He must suffer many things, and be rejected by this generation.



²⁶ And as it was in the days of Noah, so it will also be in the last days of the Son of Man.

²⁷ They ate, drank, and married wives, they were given in marriage, until the day when Noah entered the ark, and the flood came, and destroyed them all.



 28 Likewise also as it was in the days of Lot; they ate and drank, they bought and sold, they planted and built;

²⁹ but the same day Lot left Sodom it rained down fire and brimstone from heaven, and destroyed them all.



 $^{\rm 30}\,\rm Even$ so it will be on the day when the Son of Man is revealed.

³¹ On that day, he who is on the housetop, and his stuff is in the house, let him not go down to take it away: and he that is in the field, let him also not return back. There won't be time.

32 Remember Lot's wife.

³³ Whoever seeks to save his life will lose it; and whoever will lose his life will preserve it.

³⁴I tell you, in that night there will be two men in one bed; the one will be taken, and the other will be left.

³⁵ Two women will be grinding at the same place; the one will be taken, and the other left.

³⁶ Two men will be in the field; the one will be taken, and the other left.

³⁷ And sizing up the situation they asked Him, Where Lord?



And He said to them, Wherever the body is, there the vultures will gather.

What body? What a vivid metaphor! Carcass and vultures. Check out the comments of Matthew 24;28
