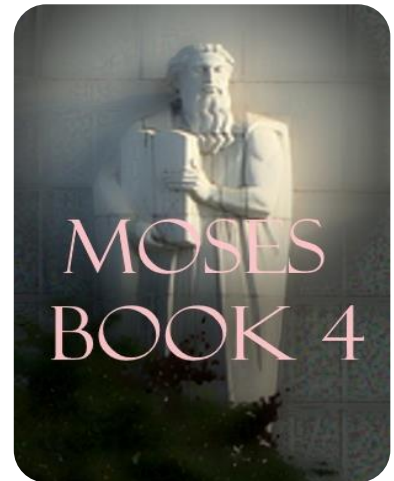


# NUMBERS 14 vs 1

In the preface to this Book of Moses we read: The titles of the five books of Moses, which we use in our Bibles, are all borrowed from the Greek translation of the Seventy, the most ancient version of the Old Testament what we know of. But the title of this book we only turn into English; in all the rest we retain the Greek word, for which difference I know no reason, but that the Latin translators have done the same. Otherwise this book might as well have been called: **Arithmoi**. Where we get our word: **arithmetic**. The Greek title = the numbering; as it shows the promise of God to Abraham that his children would be as the stars of heaven. In this book are two numberings: one at Mount Sinai in Arabia – chapter 1; and the other on the plains of Moab 39 years later. -- Matthew Henry.



How long will this people reject Me?

**<sup>1</sup> Then all the gathering lifted up their voices, and cried; and the people wept that night.**

**<sup>2</sup> And all the children of Israel grumbled against Moses and against Aaron: and the whole gathering said to them, O that we had died in the land of Egypt! or O that we had died in this wilderness!**

**<sup>3</sup> And why has the LORD brought us to this land, to fall by the sword? Our wives and our little ones will become plunder? Is it not better for us to return to Egypt?**

**<sup>4</sup> So they said one to another, Let us appoint a leader and return to Egypt.**

**<sup>5</sup> Then Moses and Aaron fell on their faces in the presence of all the assembly of the gathering of the children of Israel.**

**<sup>6</sup> And Joshua the son of Nun, and Caleb the son of Jephunneh, who were among those who spied out the land, tore their clothes:**

**<sup>7</sup> and they spoke to all the assembly of the children of Israel, saying, The land, which we passed through to spy out it, is an exceeding good land.**

**<sup>8</sup> If the LORD is please with us, then He will bring us into this land, and give it to us -- a land which flows with milk and honey.**

**<sup>9</sup> Only do not rebel against the LORD, and do not fear the people of the land; for they will be lunch for us. Their protection has departed from them, and the LORD is with us: do not fear them.**

**<sup>10</sup> But all the gathering said, stone them with stones.**

Then the glory of the LORD appeared in the tent of meeting before all the sons of Israel.

<sup>11</sup> And the LORD said to Moses, **How long will this people provoke Me?** and how long will they not believe Me, despite all the signs I have showed among them?

<sup>12</sup> I will hit them with pestilence and dispossess them, and will make you a greater nation and mightier than they.

<sup>13</sup> And Moses said to the LORD, Then the Egyptians will hear it, (for by Your strength You brought up this people from among them;)

<sup>14</sup> and they will tell the inhabitants of this land: for they have heard that You O LORD are among this people, that You O LORD are seen face to face, and that Your cloud stands over them, and that You go before them, in a pillar of cloud by day, and a pillar of fire by night.

<sup>15</sup> Now if You kill all this people as one man, then the nations who have heard of Your fame will speak, saying,

<sup>16</sup> Because the LORD was not able to bring this people into the land which He pledged to them; so He has killed them in the wilderness.

<sup>17</sup> And now I ask You, let the power of the LORD be great, according as You declared:

<sup>18</sup> The LORD is longsuffering, and of great mercy, forgiving inequality and rebellion, but by no means clearing the guilty, visiting the injustice of the fathers on the children to the third and fourth generation.

<sup>19</sup> I ask You, Pardon the inequality of this people according to the greatness of Your mercy, and as You have forgiven this people, from Egypt even until now.

<sup>20</sup> And the LORD said, I have pardoned according to your word / can you imagine, Moses never had a Bible to learn the words and ways of God, but he had the presence of mind to even change the Lord's thinking; truly he was a great man, who knew the ways, who knew what God said, and won't we be honored to know him in God's eternity:

<sup>21</sup> But as truly as I live, all the earth will be filled with the glory of the LORD.

<sup>22</sup> Surely all those who have seen My glory, and My miracles I did in Egypt and in the wilderness, and tested Me now these **ten times**, and have not listened to My voice;

<sup>23</sup> surely they will not see the land which I pledged to their fathers, nor will any of those who rejected Me see it:

<sup>24</sup> but My servant **Caleb**, because he had a different spirit with him, and has followed Me fully, I will bring him into the land he entered; and his descendants will possess it.

<sup>25</sup> (Now the Amalekites and the Canaanites live in the valleys.) Turn tomorrow, and set out to the wilderness by the way of the Red Sea.

<sup>26</sup> And the LORD spoke to Moses and to Aaron, saying,

<sup>27</sup> How long will I bear with this evil gathering, who grumble against Me? I have heard the grumbings of the children of Israel, which they grumble against Me.

<sup>28</sup> Say to them, As truly as I live, says the LORD, **as you have spoken in My ears**, so I will do to you / in other words, sometimes it's best to keep our mouth shut: God is not sitting in heaven thinking up things to do against people who bad mouth Him, He just has a better mind than us, and remembers what we complain about; and He just might say to us: so be it – your will be done:

<sup>29</sup> Your carcasses will fall in this wilderness; and all who were numbered with you, according to your complete number, from 20 years old and upward who grumbled against Me.

<sup>30</sup> Surely you will not enter the land in which I pledged to have you dwell, except **Caleb** the son of Jephunneh, and **Joshua** the son of Nun.

<sup>31</sup> But your little ones, who you said would be plundered, I will bring them in, and they will know the land which you rejected.

<sup>32</sup> But as for you, your carcasses, they will fall in this wilderness.

<sup>33</sup> And your children will wander in the wilderness forty years, and bear your faithless whoring, until your carcasses lie ruined in the wilderness.

<sup>34</sup> After the number of days you spied out the land, even forty days, each day for a year, you will bear your iniquities, even forty years, and you will know My opposition.

<sup>35</sup> I the LORD have spoken, surely I will do it to all this evil gathering, who are gathered together against Me. In this wilderness they will be destroyed, and there they will die.

<sup>36</sup> As for the men, who Moses sent to spy out the land, who returned, and made all the gathering to grumble against him, by bringing out a bad report about the land,

<sup>37</sup> even those men who brought up the bad report on the land, died by a plague before the LORD.

<sup>38</sup> But **Joshua** the son of Nun, and **Caleb** the son of Jephunneh still lived, who were of those men who spied out the land.

<sup>39</sup> And when Moses spoke these words to all the sons of Israel: the people mourned greatly.

<sup>40</sup> And they rose up early in the morning, and went up to the ridge of the mountain, saying, Here we are, we have sinned, and will go up to the place the LORD has promised.

<sup>41</sup> But Moses said, Why do you transgress the command of the LORD? you will not prosper.

<sup>42</sup> Do not go up, lest you be struck down by your enemies, for the LORD is not with you.

<sup>43</sup> For the Amalekites and the Canaanites will be there before you, and you will fall by the sword: because you turned from the LORD, so the LORD will not be with you.

<sup>44</sup> But they recklessly went up to the ridge of the mountain: yet the ark of the covenant of the LORD, nor Moses left the camp.

<sup>45</sup> Then the Amalekites and Canaanites who lived in that hill came down, and hit them, and rattled them, as far as Hormah.
