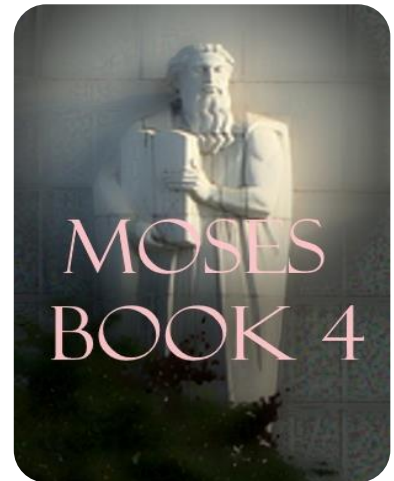

In the preface to this Book of Moses we read: The titles of the five books of Moses, which we use in our Bibles, are all borrowed from the Greek translation of the Seventy, the most ancient version of the Old Testament what we know of. But the title of this book we only turn into English; in all the rest we retain the Greek word, for which difference I know no reason, but that the Latin translators have done the same. Otherwise this book might as well have been called: **Arithmoi**. Where we get our word: **arithmetic**. The Greek title = the numbering; as it shows the promise of God to Abraham that his children would be as the stars of heaven. In this book are two numberings: one at Mount Sinai in Arabia – chapter 1; and the other on the plains of Moab 39 years later. -- Matthew Henry.



The the Dedication of the Altar

**<sup>1</sup> And it happened on the day, that Moses finished setting up the tent of meeting, and anointed it, and dedicated it, with all its furnishings, and the altar and all its vessels, and anointed them, and dedicated them.**

**<sup>2</sup> Then the leaders of Israel, heads of the households of their fathers gave their offerings, who were the leaders of the tribes, and were over those who were numbered:**

**<sup>3</sup> And they brought their offering before the LORD, six covered carts, and twelve oxen; a cart for two leaders, and an ox for each on: and they presented them before the tent.**

**<sup>4</sup> And the LORD spoke to Moses, saying,**

**<sup>5</sup> Accept this from them, that they are used in service of the tent of meeting; and you give them to the Levites, to every man according to his service.**

**<sup>6</sup> And Moses took the carts and the oxen, and gave them to the Levites.**

**<sup>7</sup> Two carts and four oxen he gave to the sons of Gershon, according to their service:**

**<sup>8</sup> And four carts and eight oxen he gave to the sons of Merari, according to their service, under the hand of Ithamar the son of Aaron the priest.**

**<sup>9</sup> But to the sons of Kohath he gave none: because the service of the sanctuary belonging to them was to carry the objects on their shoulders.**

**<sup>10</sup> And the leaders presented for dedicating the altar when it was anointed, then the leaders presented their offering before the altar.**

<sup>11</sup> And the LORD said to Moses, They will present their offering, one ruler each day, for the dedication of the altar.

<sup>12</sup> Now the **first** day, Nahshon the son of Amminadab, of the tribe of **Judah** presented:

<sup>13</sup> And his offering was one silver plate, its weight was one hundred and thirty shekels, one silver bowl of seventy shekels, according to the shekel of the sanctuary; both of them were full of fine flour mixed with oil for a grain offering:

<sup>14</sup> One gold pan of ten shekels, full of incense:

<sup>15</sup> One young bull, one ram, one male lamb a year old, for a burnt offering:

<sup>16</sup> One goat for a sin offering:

<sup>17</sup> and for a sacrifice of peace offerings, two oxen, five rams, five male goats, five male lambs one year old. This was the offering of Nahshon the son of Amminadab.



<sup>18</sup> On the **second** day, Nethanel the son of Zuar, ruler of Issachar, presented:

<sup>19</sup> He presented for his offering one silver plate, its weight was one hundred and thirty shekels, one silver bowl of seventy shekels, after the shekel of the sanctuary; both of them were full of fine flour mixed with oil for a grain offering:

<sup>20</sup> One gold pan of ten shekels, full of incense:

<sup>21</sup> One young bull, one ram, one male lamb a year old, for a burnt offering:

<sup>22</sup> One goat for a sin offering:

<sup>23</sup> and for a sacrifice of peace offerings, two oxen, five rams, five male goats, five male lambs one year old. This was the offering of Nethanel the son of Zuar.

<sup>24</sup> On the **third** day, Eliab the son of Helon, ruler of the children of Zebulun, presented:

<sup>25</sup> His offering was one silver plate, its weight was one hundred and thirty shekels, one silver bowl of seventy shekels, after the shekel of the sanctuary; both of them were full of fine flour mixed with oil for a grain offering:

<sup>26</sup> One gold pan of ten shekels, full of incense:

<sup>27</sup> One young bull, one ram, one male lamb a year old, for a burnt offering:

<sup>28</sup> One goat for a sin offering:

<sup>29</sup> and for a sacrifice of peace offerings, two oxen, five rams, five male goats, five male lambs one year old. This was the offering of Eliab the son of Helon.

<sup>30</sup> On the **fourth** day, Elizur the son of Shedeur, ruler of the children of Reuben, presented:

<sup>31</sup> His offering was one silver plate of the weight of one hundred and thirty shekels, one silver bowl of seventy shekels, after the shekel of the sanctuary; both of them were full of fine flour mixed with oil for a grain offering:

<sup>32</sup> One gold pan of ten shekels, full of incense:

<sup>33</sup> One young bull, one ram, one male lamb a year old, for a burnt offering:

<sup>34</sup> One goat for a sin offering:

<sup>35</sup> and for a sacrifice of peace offerings, two oxen, five rams, five male goats, five male lambs one year old. This was the offering of Elizur the son of Shedeur.

<sup>36</sup> On the **fifth** day, Shelumiel the son of Zurishaddai, ruler of the children of Simeon, presented:

<sup>37</sup> His offering was one silver plate, its weight was one hundred and thirty shekels, one silver bowl of seventy shekels, after the shekel of the sanctuary; both of them were full of fine flour mixed with oil for a grain offering:

<sup>38</sup> One gold pan of ten shekels, full of incense:

<sup>39</sup> One young bull, one ram, one male lamb a year old, for a burnt offering:

<sup>40</sup> One goat for a sin offering:

<sup>41</sup> and for a sacrifice of peace offerings, two oxen, five rams, five male goats, five male lambs one year old. This was the offering of Shelumiel the son of Zurishaddai.

<sup>42</sup> On the **sixth** day, Eliasaph the son of Deuel, ruler of the children of Gad, presented:

<sup>43</sup> His offering was one silver plate of the weight of one hundred and thirty shekels, a silver bowl of seventy shekels, after the shekel of the sanctuary; both of them were full of fine flour mixed with oil for a grain offering:

**50 One gold pan of ten shekels, full of incense:**

**51 One young bull, one ram, one male lamb a year old, for a burnt offering:**

**52 One goat for a sin offering:**

**53 and for a sacrifice of peace offerings, two oxen, five rams, five male goats, five male lambs one year old. This was the offering of Elishama the son of Ammihud.**

**54 On the **eighth** day, Gamaliel the son of Pedahzur, ruler of the children of Manasseh presented:**

**55 His offering was one silver plate of the weight of one hundred and thirty shekels, one silver bowl of seventy shekels, after the shekel of the sanctuary; both of them were full of fine flour mixed with oil for a grain offering:**

**56 One gold pan of ten shekels, full of incense:**

**57 One young bull, one ram, one male lamb a year old, for a burnt offering:**

<sup>61</sup> His offering was one silver plate, its weight was one hundred and thirty shekels, one silver bowl of seventy shekels, after the shekel of the sanctuary; both of them were full of fine flour mixed with oil for a grain offering:

<sup>63</sup> One young bull, one ram, one male lamb a year old, for a burnt offering:

<sup>64</sup> One goat for a sin offering:

<sup>67</sup> His offering was one silver plate, its weight was one hundred and thirty shekels, one silver bowl of seventy shekels, after the shekel of the sanctuary; both of them were full of fine flour mixed with oil for a grain offering:

<sup>68</sup> One gold pan of ten shekels, full of incense:

<sup>69</sup> One young bull, one ram, one male lamb a year old, for a burnt offering:

<sup>70</sup> One goat for a sin offering:

<sup>71</sup> and for a sacrifice of peace offerings, two oxen, five rams, five male goats, five male lambs one year old. This was the offering of Ahiezer the son of Ammishaddai.

<sup>72</sup> On the **eleventh** day, Pagiel the son of Ochran, ruler of the children of Asher, presented:

<sup>73</sup> His offering was one silver plate, its weight was one hundred and thirty shekels, one silver bowl of seventy shekels, after the shekel of the sanctuary; both of them were full of fine flour mixed with oil for a grain offering:

<sup>74</sup> One gold pan of ten shekels, full of incense:

<sup>75</sup> One young bull, one ram, one male lamb a year old, for a burnt offering:

<sup>76</sup> One goat for a sin offering:

<sup>77</sup> and for a sacrifice of peace offerings, two oxen, five rams, five male goats, five male lambs one year old. This was the offering of Pagiel the son of Ochran.

<sup>78</sup> On the **twelfth** day, Ahira the son of Enan, ruler of the children of Naphtali, presented:

<sup>79</sup> His offering was one silver plate, its weight was one hundred and thirty shekels, one silver bowl of seventy shekels, after the shekel of the sanctuary; both of them were full of fine flour mixed with oil for a grain offering:

<sup>80</sup> One gold pan of ten shekels, full of incense:

<sup>81</sup> One young bull, one ram, one male lamb a year old, for a burnt offering:

<sup>82</sup> One goat for a sin offering:

<sup>83</sup> and for a sacrifice of peace offerings, two oxen, five rams, five male goats, five male lambs one year old. This was the offering of Ahira the son of Enan.

<sup>84</sup> **This was the dedication of the altar**, in the day when it was anointed, by the leaders of Israel: twelve plates of silver, twelve silver bowls, twelve pans of gold: / remember, it was no cathedral; just a simple temporary tent in the wilderness – designed by God.

<sup>85</sup> Each plate of silver weighing one hundred and thirty shekels, each bowl seventy: all the silver vessels weighed two thousand and four hundred shekels, after the shekel of the sanctuary:

<sup>86</sup> The gold pans were twelve, full of incense, weighing ten shekels apiece, after the shekel of the sanctuary: all the gold of the pans was one hundred and twenty shekels.

<sup>87</sup> All the oxen for the burnt offering were twelve bulls, the rams twelve, the lambs a year old twelve, with their grain offering: and the goats for sin offering twelve.

<sup>88</sup> And all the oxen for the sacrifice of the peace offerings were twenty and four bulls, the rams sixty, the he goats sixty, the lambs a year old sixty. This was the dedication of the altar, afterward it was anointed.

<sup>89</sup> <sup>89</sup> And when Moses went into the tent of meeting to speak with Him, then he heard the voice of One speaking to him from the mercy seat that was on the ark of testimony, from between the two cherubim:

**and He spoke to him.** / Our great God spoke directly to Moses, whom He called the most humble man on earth. Who can imagine this encounter; I bet Moses was all ears, as he stood there. And can we thank the Lord God that He permitted us to live in our broken, very imperfect 21<sup>st</sup> century? It's difficult to read chapters like these in the Bible, and try to remember all the details.

And add to all this repetition,

it is often difficult to remember that: the blood of bulls and goats could never take away sin it was impossible; and the law made nobody perfect.
