**<sup>1</sup> My son, keep my words, and treasure my instructions within you.**

**<sup>2</sup> Keep my instructions, and live; and my law as the apple of your eye / my instruction as something of special value; to be guarded with utmost care.**

**<sup>3</sup> Bind them on your fingers, write them on the tablet of your heart.**

**<sup>4</sup> Say to wisdom, You are my darling; and call understanding your intimate friend:**

**<sup>5</sup> That they may keep you from the fool **strange woman**, from the **stranger who flatters with words** / remember, it is the devil, and none is stranger, more brash, more deceptive to the people of God; he is prowling seeking whom he can devour.**

What's the faithless whore thinking?

**<sup>6</sup> For at the opening of her house she looked through the lattice,**



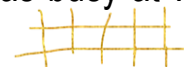
**<sup>7</sup> and saw among the simple / the naive, and discerned among the youth, a young man void of understanding / lacking good sense,**

**<sup>9</sup> in the twilight, in the evening, in the middle of the night, and in darkness.**

**<sup>10</sup> And, behold, a woman** comes out to meet him, dressed like a harlot, and crafty of heart.

**<sup>11</sup> -- she is loud and stubborn** / she is boisterous and rebellious; **her feet do not** remain in her home:

**<sup>12</sup> now she is outside, now in the streets** / restless and restive, **lurking in wait at every corner.**

**<sup>13</sup> So she seizes him and kisses him, and with a brazen face says to him,**

**<sup>14</sup> I have peace offerings with me** / approaching him with a well-seasoned platter, full of freshly broiled meat – they didn't have fast-food at the time; probably what her last patron hadn't consumed;

**for today I paid my vows** / or had the last customer just paid her.

**<sup>15</sup> So I came out to meet you** / sucker...  
**diligently to seek your face, and I found you.**

**<sup>16</sup> I have spread my couch with tapestries, with colored linens of Egypt** / so she freshened up her STD sweatshop... with the latest in exotic goods; shaking out all the head lice, and scabies and bugs.



**<sup>17</sup> I perfumed my bed with myrrh, aloes, and cinnamon** / emptying every fresh scent container covering all the raunchy smells of the last sucker ejaculating in her same STD cul-de-sac, the previous hour.

**<sup>18</sup> Come, let us take our fill of love until the morning: let us relieve ourselves in caresses.**

<sup>24</sup> **Now, O children, listen to me, and pay attention to the words of my mouth / my lips are not just moving; Moses told us, [man lives by every word that proceeds from the mouth of the LORD](#) – Deut. 8.**

<sup>25</sup> **Do **not** let your heart turn to her ways, do **not** go astray into her paths;**

<sup>26</sup> **for many are the victims she has brought down dead: yes, many are all her slain.**

<sup>27</sup> **Her house is the way to Sheol / the garbage dump, descending to the chambers of death.**
