Title: For the Chief musician, this Psalm is assigned to the usual overseer of song. When a man does his work well, there is no use to call for others. The Hebrew calls it: a Shur and Mizmor, a combination of psalm and song; A Lyrical Poem. In this case, this Psalm may be said or sung. Psalm 30 and Psalm 48 are two such Psalms, and now we have the 1st of a little series of four Psalms. Psalms of pleading and longing should always be followed by praise.

Divisions: David sings of the glory of God in the assembly and in nature. Here he has composed a Harvest Hymn for all ages. He begins with the way to approach God (1-4); next we see the Lord of wonders in answer to prayer (5-8); and last we sing the Harvest song (9-13) -- Charles Spurgeon.

- O God, before You is silence, and praise in Zion: and to You the vow will be completed.
- ²O You who hears prayer, to You all mankind will come,
- ³ saying crimes prevail against me: as for our stepping over the line, yet You forgive them.
- ⁴ Blessed is the one You choose and bring near, to live in Your courts: we are pleased with the goodness of Your house, Your holy temple.

- ⁸ And they are awed by Your miraculous signs, who dwell in the furthest parts: You make the morning dawn and evening to rejoice.

Think about it: O Lord, You are God; who made heaven and earth; and the sea, and all that is in it. How beautiful are the words of this magnificent hymn of praise, inspired 3000 years ago; as the earth rolls on in its course blessing those on earth in seed-time and in harvest; the sun rises and sets so surely; the seasons run on amid all their changes: evidence of the steadfast care of our Almighty God.

⁹ You visit the earth, and water it: You greatly enrich it; the river of God overflows with water: You provide their grain, and so You prepared it,

- watering its furrows, settling its ridges, and softening it with showers: You bless its growth.
- 11 crowning it with Your goodness; and Your paths drip with abundance.
- 12 They sprinkle the wilderness pastures: the hills are robed with joy.
- The pastures are clothed with flocks; and the valleys are covered with grain; they shout for joy, they also sing.
